**AGENDA TITLE:** Adopt Short-Range Improvement Plan for Public Safety Building Remodel and Direct Staff to Develop Funding Alternatives for the Short- and Long-Range Projects

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:** That the City Council take the following actions with regards to the Public Safety Building Master Plan Study:

1. Adopt the immediate short-range plan presented to the City Council at its Shirtsleeve Session of October 21, 1997.
2. Direct City staff to develop funding alternatives for the short-range and long-range solutions.
3. Direct City staff to obtain a proposal from EKONA for the preparation of plans and specifications for the short-range project.
4. Direct City staff to further investigate the long-range solution to Civic Center parking needs, alternative site for Fire Station No. 1 in the Downtown area, and the best option for the long-range solution of the Public Safety Building.
5. Direct City staff to contact and meet with the San Joaquin County related to its future plans for local court facilities.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:** The short-range and long-range solutions in the Public Safety Building Master Plan Study were presented to the City Council at its Shirtsleeve Session of October 21, 1997. Because of Council's desire to move immediately on the replacement of the HVAC headworks systems, the architectural firm of EKONA was requested to provide us a proposal for the preparation of plans and specifications for the Public Safety Building HVAC upgrade.

A final copy of the Public Safety Building Master Plan Study will be forwarded to the City Council per its request.

**FUNDING:** None required at this time.


