NORTHERN AND CENTRAL CALIFORNIA WEATHER SUMMARY  
NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA  
6 PM PST THU JAN 2 1997

HEAVY RAIN SHIFTED SOUTH INTO CENTRAL CALIFORNIA THURSDAY AFTERNOON AS COOLER...DRIER AIR MOVED INTO THE NORTHERN PART OF THE STATE. DOWNPOURS ON THURSDAY WERE FOCUSED ON THE SIERRA NEVADA FROM INTERSTATE 80 SOUTH...IN THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA...AND IN THE SANTA CRUZ AND SANTA LUCIA MOUNTAINS.

MANY CITIES IN THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA RECEIVED ONE TO TWO INCHES OF RAIN IN THE 24 HOURS ENDING AT 4 PM THURSDAY...WITH TWO TO FIVE INCHES IN THE MOUNTAINS. FOUR TO EIGHT INCHES FELL IN THE SIERRA NEVADA FROM INTERSTATE 80 SOUTH. FLOODING CONTINUED ON MANY RIVERS AND CREEKS THROUGHOUT THE REGION...BUT THE GOOD NEWS WAS THAT RIVERS WERE RECEDING OVER ALMOST ALL OF NORTHERN CALIFORNIA BY THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

LATE AFTERNOON TEMPERATURES WERE IN THE 50S AT LOWER ELEVATIONS OF THE NORTH...WITH 60S IN CENTRAL CALIFORNIA. MOUNTAIN READINGS WERE IN THE UPPER 30S AND 40S. EXTREMES ACROSS NORTHERN AND CENTRAL CALIFORNIA ON THURSDAY RANGED FROM 33 AT BODIE STATE PARK TO 69 AT BAKERSFIELD.

RELIEF FROM THE DOWNPOURS IS ON THE WAY. THE COOLER...DRIER AIR THAT MOVED INTO NORTHERN CALIFORNIA TODAY WILL MOVE INTO THE CENTRAL PART OF THE STATE TONIGHT AND FRIDAY...AND RAIN WILL DIMINISH TO SHOWERS ACROSS OUR ENTIRE REGION. THE COOLER AIR WILL BRING SNOW BACK TO THE HIGHER MOUNTAINS...WHICH WILL ALSO HELP THE FLOOD SITUATION BY INHIBITING RUNOFF.
