Proposal for the development of a Lodi facility for homeless women & children. - 3 pages

Proposed Objective. To open a Lodi facility for women and children within the next 12 months.

Proposed Mission Statement. 'Lodi House' will offer transitional housing (A place to move through) and social service & employment resources for a maximum of 30 days to enable clients to begin to rejoin and become productive in our society.

Where we are.

Currently forming a small feasibility study group, representative of various aspects of Lodi community

First United Methodist Church - Lodi has established a fund with substantial donations for the development & establishment of a facility for homeless women and children in Lodi

Locally there is already some financial commitment for ongoing support.

Members of Lodi Council of Churches, Lodi Church Women United, The Salvation Army, others in the faith community, AAUW, Lodi Women's Center, Lodi Community Service Center, as well as other organizations & various individuals throughout San Joaquin County acknowledge and support the concept of a homeless facility for women and children in Lodi. A meeting was held in November, 1997 with representatives from various organizations and agencies exploring this issue. The next step hasn't been taken.

(Questions)

- . Define transitional housing as applied to this facility
- . Specifically what sort of facility is needed. Women & children or family facility. Facilities for how many? Evaluate alternatives to meal service. (Serving meals or diets provided resources for preparing own meals or option of meals at Arhway Shelter.) Needs assessment important! (Can vouchers do the same job more economically?)

Hire experienced consultant to do 'Prospectus' for facility addressing goals and questions?

- . What funding is available both public and private?
- . Resources and personnel to seek funding?
- . Administration, management & staffing of facility?
- . Board of Directors?
- . Availability & problems of 'blended funding' (private & govt.)
- . Gov't constraints and requirements?
- . Safety code requirements?
- . What kind of private organization and/or legal entity will drive this facility. Existing or new entity?
- . Ongoing funding & management?

- . Have visited all but one homeless facility in San Joaquin County. Found that annual operating budgets range from \$85,000 to approximately \$200,000 including debt service. The key appeared to be to set up a facility without debt or mortgage.

- . Spoken to community people who were involved in establishment of local Archway Shelter and Golden Era Hotel.

- . Met with Paula Soto, Lodi Community Service Center and others in community discussing the status of homelessness in Lodi.

Goals:

- . To form a committee to study and develop all aspect of a community based facility. Committee to include members drawn from a cross section of the Lodi community, including the faith community.

- . To complete a needs assessment of the situation of homeless women and children in Lodi.

- . To decide on an appropriate name for the facility.

- . Evaluate funding options, including applications for Lodi Block Grant, private & public foundations, and federal, state, county & local gov't. funding.

- . Look at supporting resources currently available.

- . Develop a specific budget and cash flow projection for three years. Identify funding for first three years.

- . Develop plans and guidelines for a Lodi facility. Such plans would include time limits, house rules (inc. drug-free environment), clients use of resources and support services, development of a personal plan, clients responsibilities for living space and public areas of facility.

- . Working with City of Lodi zoning, acquire property that will provide the needed facilities in a community setting. (At this point a large residence is preferred over apartments, near social service resources, public transportation, and schools within the City of Lodi.)

*About **ROADS** the Up With People Show*

WHAT: **ROADS, Up With People's new show, is the story of youth. Youth with hope and enthusiasm, coming together at a fork in the road.**

Central to the two-hour show is people — how youth lead youth and people make a difference. In **ROADS**, original music and storyline move through a tug-of-war between generations and between opposing interests and priorities, ending in a constructive resolution of those differences. Also integral to the show: a farewell musical tour of the 1900s and contemporary and folk songs and dances from around the world.

A video opener shows Up With People casts in action — how they serve the people they visit and turn the world into their classroom. More than 20 million people, from Superbowl and Olympics fans to audiences in concert halls, youth centers, prisons, schools and hospitals, have seen and been a part of Up With People's show since its founding 33 years ago.

WHO: Up With People is the international learning program that provides personal and professional growth through the unique combination of world travel, performing arts, and community service. The purpose of UWP is to develop the potential in people to bring the world together through friendship and understanding. More than 700 college-age students from 30-35 countries travel worldwide in five Up With People casts each year. Founded in 1965, and incorporated in 1968 as an independent, not-for-profit, educational organization, Up With People has visited 59 countries and has over 17,500 alumni from more than 90 countries.

The 700-plus college-aged students from around the world who come together in five musical casts of 140 each to entertain, serve and learn from the people they visit and live with each year in some 400 communities spanning 15-20 countries.
