RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the Public Works Director to submit projects for the State-Local Partnership Program (Senate Bill 300) on behalf of the City.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Under this program, agencies submit projects to the State for up to 50% match on qualified projects. The State match depends on the number of projects that are approved and the funds available for distribution. The more projects, the lower the percentage of the match. It is estimated that the match for the fiscal year 1991 projects will be approximately 14% of total project cost. This will provide Lodi approximately 360,000 of new street dollars in 1991. The State has asked that the person signing the application for these projects be authorized by resolution,


