NOTICE OF FILING

TO: The State of California Attorney General, Department
of General Services, County and City Officials:

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PGandE) hereby gives notice that in Application No. 85-12-50 filed with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) on December 27, 1985, it has requested authorization, among other things, to increase PGandE's electric and gas rates and charges for service.

PGandE has requested that it be allowed to increase its electric rates by \$750,025,000 or 13.4% and its gas rates \$221,510,000 or 5.8%, both to become effective January 1, 1987. PGandE's cost of doing business is expected to rise during 1988 and 1989. Consequently, in conformance with Commission procedures governing three-year rate case intervals, PGandE also has included in its Application a request that electric and gas rates be further increased, effective January 1, 1988, to produce additional revenues of \$273,625,000 and \$130,543,000, respectively, and that electric and gas rates also be further increased, effective January 1, 1989, to produce additional revenues in 1989 of \$303,085,000 and \$102,810,000, respectively.


PGandE seeks the proposed increases in gas and electric rates in order to recover the increased costs which PGandE anticipates will be incurred in the 1987 Test Year and the 1988 and 1989 Attrition Years in order to provide and maintain quality service to its customers. The costs sought to be recovered include all non-fuel operation and maintenance expenses, depreciation, taxes, and a fair

return on rate base.

As these future years approach, and more information becomes available, under established procedures of the Commission, PGandE will modify its requests to reflect expected conditions.


