PRIORITY PLAN FOR EXPENDITURES FOR THE  
CALIFORNIA PARKLANDS ACT OF 1980


Pursuant to Section 5096.156 of the subject act, counties throughout the state are delegated the responsibility of consulting with the various cities and special districts eligible for funding and arrive at a "Priority Plan for Expenditures".

On February 4, 1981, the six cities of San Joaquin County were represented at a meeting to discuss and carry back to their respective city councils a recommended program of distribution. The proposed distribution allocates a minimum project, as defined under the 1976 Act, of \$25,000 to Ripon and Escalon, and per capita distribution to the remaining cities based on the 1980 census. The County's allocation is based on the unincorporated population of the county.

As required in the Act, 50% of the cities representing 50% of the cities population within the county must approve the proposal plan. The allocations for each agency within the county are set forth below:


Attached herewith is a resolution as proscribed by the Act signifying to the State an approved "Priority Plan for Expenditure". Exhibit "A" indicates the actual dollar distribution as listed above; and Exhibit "B" certifies the appropriate cities approval of the plan.

In order that any project within San Joaquin County may be funded in the State FY81-82 budget, it is necessary that the attached resolution arrive at the State Department of Parks and Recreation not later than March 1, 1981. Furthermore, staff has proceeded with a specific project application for the Regional Sports Complex that must arrive at the State by March 15, 1981 so that funds will be available by September 1981.

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Board of Supervisors adopt the attached resolution approving the "Priority Plan for Expenditure" for the California Parklands Act of 1980.
2. That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors be authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of said resolution with exhibits to the State Department of Parks and Recreation.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PRIORITY PLAN FOR EXPENDITURES UNDER  
PROVISIONS OF THE CALIFORNIA PARKLANDS ACT OF 1980

WHEREAS, the California Parklands Act of 1980 requires that each county shall consult with all cities and districts within the County which are eligible to receive grant funds under provisions of Section 5096.156 of the Act and develop and submit to the State for approval a priority plan for expenditure of the county's allocation; and

WHEREAS, said priority plan shall reflect consideration of deficiencies within the county in the preservation of historical resources and natural landscapes as well as in the provision of recreational areas and facilities; and

WHEREAS, said priority plan shall also reflect regional park or open-space needs as well as community and neighborhood park and recreation needs in any county in which a regional park or open-space district is wholly or partially located; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Joaquin has consulted with said cities and districts and has prepared a priority plan for expenditure of the county's allocation which reflects the deficiencies and needs required by the Program and includes expenditures by eligible cities and districts, said priority plan being attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A", and

WHEREAS, said priority plan has been approved by at least fifty percent (50%) of the cities and districts representing fifty percent (50%) of the population of the cities and districts within the county, said approval being shown on Exhibit "B" attached hereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the priority plan for expenditures of the county's allocation of funds under the California Parklands Act of 1980; and

PRIORITY PLAN FOR EXPENDITURES

The "Priority Plan for Expenditures" for distribution of funds allocated to San Joaquin County from the California Parklands Act of 1980 shall be as follows:
