RELIGHTING OF THE LODI MISSION ARCH

Several years ago, the City Council as a part of its energy conservation program directed that the Lodi Arch no longer be lit.

This office has received a number of contacts requesting that the Arch be relit. The callers indicated their feelings that the Arch has long been considered as the official entrance to the City and holds considerable sentimental value to many citizens of this community.

The Arch has been designated as a State Historical Landmark and has been registered in the National Register of Historical Places.

The design for the proposed downtown improvement district includes a beautification plan for the area surrounding the Arch.

It is therefore proposed that the City Council consider the relighting of this historical "symbol" of our community as an expression of welcome to all those who enter our city.
