Council was informed that the Lodi Police Department is currently using patrol officers to perform services needed to provide a variety of crime prevention programs.

As a part of the Career Criminal Apprehension Program (C-CAP), the City is eligible for a Community Crime Resistance Grant through the Office of Criminal Justice Planning. This Grant would provide funds to hire two non-sworn Community Service Officers which the Police Department would use in their crime prevention programs.

The grant is twelve months in duration and will pay 100% of the cost of personnel, plus equipment. The City of Lodi is eligible for a \$60,000 grant which requires a 10% hard match of City funds.

Chief of Police Williams and Captain Larry Hansen were in the audience and responded to questions regarding the matter as were posed by Council.

Following discussion, on motion of Council Member Hinchman, Olson second, Council adopted Resolution No. 86-70 indicating the City's desire to undertake the proposed Lodi Police Department Community Crime Resistance Program, which program is to be funded in part with funds made available through State General Funds.
