Following introduction of the matter by Mayor Hinchman, and Council discussion, Council, on motion of Council Member Olson, Hinchman second, directed the City Clerk to send a letter on behalf of the Lodi City Council to the State of California, Department of Transportation supporting the construction of a 50-foot fixed span bridge over Little Potato Slough on Highway 12.

Dear Mr. Jelenck:

The City Council of the City of Lodi, at its regular meeting of June 5, 1985, unanimously endorsed the construction of a 50 foot fixed span bridge over Little Potato Slough. It is felt that a 50 foot fixed span bridge would insure uninterrupted traffic flow, decrease accidents caused by traffic stoppage and would provide free passage to over 99 percent of all boating.

The Council based its endorsement on the bases that this type of structure would best serve the public and those using the waterways.
