City Clerk Reimche presented a letter received from Assemblyman Robert W. Naylor in reply to Lodi's recent letter on state aid to local governments, which read in part as follows:

"We are in complete agreement that the Governor's proposal to cut \$450 million from local funding is totally un-acceptable. My Assembly Republican colleagues and I are insisting that at least \$200 million be added to the budget for local government aid. The Governor's proposal would restructure the financial relationship to the extent that some cities would actually be subsidizing the State budget".


Dear Ms. Reimche:
