Mr. Cook would provide the City with the necessary insurance coverage and requests that as his fee for providing this service that he be allowed to retain any premiums won by this exhibit.

The City Clerk reminded the Council that the City entered into a like agreement with Mr. Cook in 1982.

A diagram depicting the proposed exhibit was presented for Council's perusal.


Dear Mr. Cook:

# Crowd, betting records fall at county fair

Good weather, a stronger economy and well-run operations are credited with enabling the Los Angeles County Fair to set records in attendance and horse wagering this year.

The 7th annual event, with the theme "A Slice of America," concluded Sunday after more than 1.4 million people visited the Pomona fairgrounds. The weekly total attendance figure of 1,397,000 broke the 1976 record attendance of 1,294,000, according to Arbelo.

The 1976 record attendance figure was set during the first day of a new 10-day record of 12,300 per Sunday. Parking records were also set during the 10-day event, Arbelo added.

"There were 140 major complaints, which helps bring people back a second and third year," Arbelo explained. "And the weather started out great but cooled off. By late afternoon, the weather was perfect."


"The economy situation was very good. It proves that negative criticism does not necessarily bring people to the fair," he added.

Arbelo also said a healthy economy meant people were spending more at the fair.

Visitors also set a record for

lots at the fair's horse races, wagering nearly \$9 million compared to the 1976 record of \$8.1 million, Arbelo said. Of the 12 racing days, single-day wagering records were set on 10 days, he said, including Saturday's new all-day mark of \$1,197,100.

Wagering was 25 percent higher than last year, Arbelo said, because rain washed out several race days in 1976.

Plans are already being prepared for next year's county fair, which will run Sept. 11-23, he added.



Three of them, said Robinson, tie in well with the fair's "Slice of America" theme. These are of a violinist, mother and baby, and an outdoorsman carrying

deer. The fourth is of a ship shrouded in fog. Other countries represented include Czechoslovakia, Austria, Ecuador and Panama. Another first is a slide from a Japanese photographer. The exhibition is but one of more than a dozen major divisions that can be seen at the fair through Sept. 30. There also will be opportunity to participate in some areas.

Education Expo is a showcase of artwork, handicrafts, photography and science projects of students from 37 Los Angeles County school districts. The exhibit also offers daily demonstrations and entertainment. A touch of culture will accent the fair's run with a fine arts exhibition of world-famous artists. Also, an international photography salon features award-winning prints and slides from 34 nations. In addition, the Schlitz Stage is the site of a variety of professional entertainment, including Shari Lewis and her puppet friends, magical acts by Chuck Jones, the legendary Kingston Trio, Jim Stafford of recording, film and television fame and the Lawrence Welk

# GENERAL INFORMATION

**HOURS:** Gates and buildings open at 10 a.m. Monday through Friday; at 9 a.m. Saturdays and Sundays. Buildings close nightly at 10 p.m. except Fridays and Saturdays when closing is at 11 p.m.

**INFORMATION:** General information about the Fair can be obtained at any one of the four Herald Examiner Information Booths.

**LOST CHILDREN:** Security offices at the Clock Tower (near Main Gate) and carnival entrance are collecting points for lost children. Trained personnel are on duty.

**FIRST AID:** Event Medical Services operates a first aid dispensary at the end of the Grandstand. Professional staff is on duty at all times.

**FIRE AND POLICE STATIONS:** In operation 24 hours a day.

**SECURITY:** Security personnel are available at all times throughout the grounds.

**LOST & FOUND:** Located in the Police Station at the Main Carnival entrance.

**CLOCK TOWER:** If you should become lost or separated from your party it is suggested you use the Clock Tower as a central meeting point.

**BANKING:** First Interstate Bank, located near the Clock Tower, provides complete banking facilities from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily.

**POST OFFICE:** Adjacent to Bank — open daily from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.

**NURSERY & PLAYGROUND:** A free, fully staffed nursery and playground are available. There is a limit of a two-hour stay (infants through 3 years) at the nursery and a limit of one-hour visits at the playground. The playground is open 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily. Nursery hours are 1 - 8:30 p.m. Monday — Thursday, 1 - 9:30 p.m. Fridays and 10:30 a.m. - 9:30 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

**WHEELCHAIR & STROLLER RENTAL:** Available all day from several Mom's Aid locations. Wheelchairs rent for \$6; strollers rent for \$3.

**PICNIC FACILITIES:** Guests using picnic facilities may use Picnic Hill or Plaza of the States.

**KIWANIS COAT CHECK:** Facilities for checking garments and baby strollers are located under the Grandstand.

**DINING:** The Fair offers a variety of restaurants including the Top of the Fair with a complete menu and Anthony's specializing in family dining.

**FILM & SUPPLIES:** Photographic film and supplies can be purchased from the Kodak/Pomona Valley Camera Club booth at the west end of Building 4. Also available at Flower Show & Livestock.

**TRAM:** Tram Service is available in the parking lots at no charge. The on-grounds transportation charge is 50¢.

**MONORAIL STATION:** See an aerial view of the Fair on the 1-1/2 mile system. \$1.00 per person.


**SENIOR DISCOUNTS:** Senior citizens (62 years and older) are admitted for \$4 Monday through Friday.


