PERMIT PARKING  
PROGRAM AMENDMENT

Council was reminded that at its last regular meeting the City Council heard a presentation by a resident in the area of PCP cannery regarding permit parking. His concern was that he has no off-street parking at his residence. There are two or three other parcels in the subject area burdened with this unique situation. He is entitled to a permit for his vehicle and has obtained one, however, visitors to his home must park in the street and in so doing without a permit are subject to receiving a citation. In fact, a citation was issued to a visitor to his home earlier this month.

City Manager Peterson indicated that it is the staff's recommendation that the City Council approve an amendment to the permit parking program in that vicinity to provide for visitor parking only for those few parcels where no off-street parking exists.

Following discussion with questions being directed to Staff, Council, on motion of Council Member Snider, Hinchman second, adopted Resolution No. 86-124 approving an amendment to the permit parking program in the vicinity of the PCP cannery to provide for visitor parking.



RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council approve an amendment to the permit parking program in the vicinity of the PCP cannery to provide for visitor parking at certain locations.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: At its last regular meeting the City Council heard a presentation by a resident in the area of PCP cannery regarding permit parking. His concern was that he has no off-street parking at his residence. There are just two or three other parcels in the subject area burdened with this unique situation. He is entitled to a permit for his vehicle and has obtained one. However, visitors to his home (i.e. his sons, a laundry lady, etc.) must park in the street and in so doing without a permit are subject to receiving a citation. In fact, a citation was issued to a visitor to his home earlier this month.

The Finance Director and I have discussed this matter. It is the staff recommendation that the City Council approve an amendment to the permit parking program in that vicinity to provide for visitor parking only for those few parcels where no off-street parking exists. These residents would be so advised and invited to come to City hall to obtain two such permits per parcel. Two permits per parcel seems an appropriate number since most driveways in the area can accommodate two visitor cars. A copy of a draft of the permit itself is attached as Exhibit A. The permits will be numbered and will bear the address of the property for which it is issued to aid in control.

RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT TO PERMIT PARKING PROGRAM  
ESTABLISHED IN THE VICINITY OF THE PCP CANNERY

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lodi at its Regular Council Meeting of December 4, 1985 did adopt Resolution No. 85-172 - Resolution Establishing Parking Restrictions in the area of the Pacific Coast Producers Facility which set forth the following restrictions:

- 1) Each resident in the area depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and thereby made a part hereof will be provided with a resident permit
- 2) "No Parking" restrictions will be established for one (1) hour from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.; 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.; and 3:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m. except with a resident permit from June 1 through March 31.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Lodi does hereby amend Resolution No. 85-172 to provide for visitor parking for those parcels where no off-street parking exists.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Lodi does hereby authorize Staff to implement the provisions of this amendment.


