Council was apprised that the Lodi Police Department requests approval to apply for a grant from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP). The proposal seeks funding for the Anti-Drug Abuse Program in the amount of \$300,000. The program includes four agencies: Lodi Police Department, Municipal and Superior Courts, the San Joaquin County District Attorney's Office and San Joaquin County Probation Department. A cooperative effort targeted at apprehending and prosecuting offenders is the multi-agency goal. The grant provides personnel costs for two narcotics officers, one Deputy District Attorney, one half-time clerical position and one half-time probation officer, as well as an operating budget.

The program is expected to run three years. No hard match is required for the first year application. OCJP anticipates that if federal funds are available in the future, projects receiving funding the first year will receive second year funding, contingent upon their successful completion of the first year. Second and third year funding will be a non-competitive reapplication process. If the funding level decreases, the funding level of grant awards will be decreased. There may or may not be

matches in subsequent years for the multi-component model. It will depend on the amount of federal funds available. OCJP is looking forward to a three-year program dependent upon the federal budget and federal funds.

Police Captain Larry Hansen addressed the Council regarding the matter and responded to questions as posed by the Council.

Following discussion, on motion of Council Member Pinkerton, Reid second, Council adopted Resolution No. 87-126 authorizing the filing of an Anti-Drug Abuse Grant Application and authorized the Chief of Police to execute the subject document on behalf of the City of Lodi.
