Notice thereof having been published according to law, with an affidavit of such publication being on file in the office of the City Clerk, Mayor Reid called for the Public Hearing to consider the extension of restricted parking area in the vicinity of the Pacific Coast Producers Cannery.

The matter was introduced by City Manager Peterson. Providing additional information, including diagrams, was Public Works Director Jack Ronsko.

Speaking in favor of the proposal was Mrs. Elizabeth Millis, 525 South Stockton Street, Lodi.

Requesting that the extension of the parking restriction include the north side of Mission Street was Mr. Richard Ollenberger, 211 Mission Street, Lodi. Mr. Ollenberger further requested that a red zone be established on the "left side" of Stockton Street at the Mission Street intersection as it is a "blind spot".

There being no other persons in the audience wishing to speak on the matter, the public portion of the hearing was closed.



SUBJECT: Parking Restricted Area Extension in Vicinity of PCP Cannery

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council discuss the extension of the parking restricted area in the vicinity of PCP Cannery and take appropriate action.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Residents in the vicinity of PCP Cannery brought their concerns to Council regarding the parking situation just north of the residential permit area (north of Tokay Street). City Council requested staff evaluate the parking situation in this area. The area was surveyed on three occasions. Staff recommends implementing restrictions similar to those currently established south of this area. The restriction is as follows:

"No Parking" for 1 hour from
8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.
3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
3:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m.
except with resident permit

The attached exhibit shows the recommended additional permit areas and the "contact" area which has been notified for participation in the public hearing.



- B. Marked parking spaces on the subject streets so when parking spaces are used, cars will not be packed in tightly and partially onto the corner of driveways.
- C. Red paint on each corner of a driveway so drivers will know exactly when a citation will be given when parked too close to the end of a driveway.
- D. A crosswalk on Stockton Street at the intersection of Eden Street for children and pedestrians crossing Stockton Street.

Staff recommends implementing restrictions similar to those currently established south of the subject area. The restriction is as follows:

3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

3:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.



FROM STOCKTON STREET TO WASHINGTON STREET.

1. TWO (2) HOUR PARKING, MONDAY THRU FRIDAY, 6AM TO 6PM.
2. MARKED PARKING SPACES ON THE ABOVE STREETS, SO WHEN PARKING SPACES ARE USED, CARS WILL NOT BE PACKED IN TIGHTLY AND PARTIALLY ONTO THE CORNER OF DRIVEWAYS.
3. RED PAINT ON EACH CORNER OF A DRIVEWAY, SO DRIVERS WILL KNOW EXACTLY WHEN A CITATION WILL BE GIVEN WHEN PARKED TO CLOSE TO THE END OF A DRIVEWAY.
4. A CROSS WALK IS NEEDED ON STOCKTON STREET AT THE INTERSECTION OF EDEN STREET, FOR CHILDREN AND PEDESTRIANS TO CROSS STOCKTON STREET.


WHEREAS, THE CITY HAS SEEN CAUSE TO ISSUE PARKING LIMIT ENFORCEMENTS IN OTHER




