

COUNCIL CHAMBERS - CITY COUNCIL

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 3, 1945

REGULAR MEETING ROLL CALL	This regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Lodi was called to order at 8:00 o'clock P.M. of Wednesday, October 3, 1945 (Pacific Coast Standard Time), Councilmen Coffield, Riggs, Tolliver, Weihe and Rinn (Mayor) present, none absent. Also attending Glenn West, City Attorney, John A. Henning, Supt. of Public Utilities, Clinton Henning, City Engineer and George D. Polenske, Fire Chief.
MINUTES OF SEPT 19 -	Minutes of the preceding meeting held September 19, 1945 were read, approved as read and so endorsed by the Mayor.
TAMARACK & S.SACTO STS OPENING	Mrs Ida M. Pearl, representing D'Arrigo Brothers Company presented a letter from that firm and Mrs Mildred Fox tendering the City certain rights of way for street purposes in A.J.Larsons Subdivision of a Portion of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sect 12, T3N, R6E to open Tamarack Drive and South Sacramento Street over their lands. The City Clerk was authorized to accept the deeds to these parcels and the City Engineer was directed to grade and oil certain portions so that a contemplated building could be started as well as to make plans for extension of sewage and waste drainage from the plant to be erected, also for serving it with water. The Clerk was directed to obtain, if possible, deed to South Sacramento Street across the land of Panzica lying north of the Fox parcel.
FUTURE FARMERS STAND STADIUM	J. E. Conklin and Herman Diekman of Lodi Union High School presented a proposal that the rights of "Future Farmers" in the refreshment stand at Lodi Stadium be reduced to writing and made part of the existing agreement with the High School. They were referred to City Attorney Glenn West for a collaborative framing of such an agreement to be submitted the City Council later.
LOADING ZONE N.SACTO ST.	Cecil C. Perrin, on behalf of himself, Graffigna Brothers and Clarence Gilbeau requested that a two-car loading zone be marked off in the 100 block of North Sacramento Street on the East side of the street. Request ordered referred to Chief of Police Jackson for recommendation and report
NIES ALLEY PARKING	A letter from Adolph Nies complaining against parking in the alley between Oak & Walnut Streets East of Washington Street was ordered referred to the Chief of Police.
AIR PORT	A letter from "Builders of the West" advocating support of the McCarran Airport Bill now pending in Congress was referred to the Aviation Committee of Lodi District Chamber of Commerce
C OF C. UNDERPASS S.P.TRACKS	A recommendation of Lodi District Chamber of Commerce that an underpass separating the Southern Pacific tracks from the grade of city streets be constructed between Lockeford Street and Lodi Avenue was discussed. Need of this structure was admitted but location and cost, especially as to property damages seemed to make this a matter for intensive study before initiating any procedure to construct it.
LAW ENFORCE- MENT MUTUAL AID PLAN	A letter of Attorney General Kenny recommending adoption of the "Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Plan" approved by the State War Council was ordered referred to the City Attorney and City Clerk for report on its advantages or disadvantages.
GRACE P.BURNS S.P. STATION RESERVE	The City Clerk read letters written in the matter of Grace P. Burns regarding National Brotherhood of Service and to Southern Pacific Company regarding its station reservation
REPORTS.	Reports of the Chief of Police, the City Foundmaster and of the City Clerk as Garbage Collector were received, read and ordered filed. All reports covering the month of September.
BLACK & BLEWETT ALLEY BLK 13	The City Engineer was directed to obtain commitments from Glenn A. Black and C. H. Blewett that they would pay for gutters along their several properties rearing on the North and South alleyway in Block 13, Mokelumne prior to the City regrading and resurfacing this alley.

STADIUM RENTALS The Clerk reported that he has not secured sufficient information regarding charges and regulations of other owners of such facilities as the Stadium to enable any determination as to the usual method of handling their rental.

TOKAY STREET R.R. KING. In the matter of the improvement of the Tokay Street Railroad crossing, the City Engineer was directed to open negotiations with Southern Pacific Company after consulting with former City Engineer C. L. White and have a form of agreement prepared by that Company for submission to the City Council.

HECKENLAIBLE On written recommendation of City Engineer Henning, the appointment of Arthur C. Heckenlaible as Assistant City Engineer was confirmed effective September 29th at a salary of \$350.00 monthly

WEIMER On the same recommendation, Elmer Weimer from the eligible list for that position, was appointed Engineering Aid at \$240.50 effective October 1st. If and when available, Richard Price from the eligible list, was confirmed as an Engineering Aid at the same salary as Weimer above. Major Harris Munger was also approved for appointment as Engineering Aid at a salary of \$240.50 effective on his release from army duties and reporting for work.

VOSS Mr Theodore Voss, on leave from the Division of Highways, was appointed an Assistant to the City Engineer at a salary of \$315.50, both the appointments of Munger and Voss to be on a temporary basis. Acceptance of the recommendations and confirmation of the preceding appointments and salaries made on motion of Councilman Coffield, Weihe second.


ENGINEER DEPARTMENT


ROBLES Mr John A. Henning asked that George Robles appointed by him as Plant Attendant March 1, 1945 be confirmed as "re-instated" as Robles had applied for vacation leave, to which he would not be entitled if serving as a temporary employee. The City Council agreed with Mr Henning's recommendation in so far as it did not conflict with the Personnel Ordinance and Rules.
