Monday, January 17, 1938

The City Council of the City of Lodi met in regular session at 8:00 o'clock P.M. of Monday, January 17, 1938. Councilmen Clark, Graffigna, Spooner, Weihe and Steele present, none absent.

The minutes of the last meeting held January 3, 1938 were read, approved as read and so indorsed by the Mayor.

Mr. Otto Schunke representing a committee from the First Congregational Church of Lodi addressed the Council in regard to the proximity of the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks on Lockeford Street to the south curb line. At the order of the Mayor, this was referred to the Committee on Streets and Highways.

The application of Kent Watson for the position of Building Inspector was received, read and ordered filed. Also, a letter from the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners endorsing Mr. A. H. Bull for the same position.

Mr. Fred Pate applied by letter for the position of City Mechanic.

Letters from the League of California Municipalities addressed to the City Council in care of the Mayor, in regard to the district meeting to be held at Stockton on January 20th were read.

The Clerk presented several notices from the State Board of Equalization informing the Council of recent applications for the sale of alcoholic beverages in the City. On motion of Councilman Weihe, seconded by Councilman Graffigna and carried, the Clerk was directed to notify the State Board of Equalization that the City Council protested against the granting of any liquor license at No. 225 Vine Street, particularly the application of one Charles F. Zilke doing business as "Mokelumne Lodge" at this place. The Mayor informed several persons who had appeared to protest against the granting of this license, that the Council would proceed in accordance with their wishes as these premises were included in the "Multi-Family Residence Zone."

The quarterly report of the City Treasurer and that of the City Clerk were received, read and on motion of Councilman Graffigna, seconded by Councilman Weihe, ordered filed.

Four applications for business licenses were ordered granted.

The Clerk presented the report of the City Planning Commission upon the petition of Henry Fink, and others for the rezoning of certain properties in Block 10, Lodi Barnhart Tract. On motion of Councilman Clark, seconded by Councilman Weihe, 8:00 o'clock P.M. of February 7, 1938 was set as the date for the hearing of any protests filed against such rezoning.

On the recommendation of Mr. J. A. Henning and on motion of Councilman Graffigna, seconded by Councilman Weihe, the Mayor was authorized to execute an agreement with the Pacific Gas and Electric Company for the rental of transformers and transportation of the same to be used during the transition period in the city's change of distribution of voltage.

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
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Twenty-one (21) building permits for structures to cost \$15,625., application No. 1889 to and including No. 1909 were allowed and ordered granted.

Claims No. 30839 to and including No. 30907 in the total amount of \$13,857.70 were allowed and ordered paid on motion of Councilman Graffigna, seconded by Councilman Weihe.

On motion of Councilman Graffigna, the City Council then adjourned to and until the day and hour of its next regular meeting.
