WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 1941

This regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Lodi was called to order by the Mayor at 8:00 o'clock P.M. on Wednesday, February 19, 1941, Councilmen Bull, Graffigna, Riggs, Weihe and Steele present, none absent.

The minutes of the last meeting held February 5, 1941 were read, approved as read and so endorsed by the Mayor.

The delegation from the meat dealers headed by Mr. C. R. Guggolz again urged the adoption of Ordinance No. 271 introduced February 5th. These gentlemen were informed that further consideration of the ordinance would be taken up under the proper heading later on in the meeting.

A letter soliciting the privilege of submitting a proposal on the audit of the city accounts was read from Faulkner, Cakes and Faulkner.

Notice of the quarterly accumulation of the gasoline tax for Major Streets and of the increased accumulated sums as determined on the basis of the 1940 census was received from the Division of Highways.

A certificate of the Director of the Census stating that the population of the City of Lodi as determined by the census of 1940 was 11,079 persons was received and ordered filed.

Notice of the quarterly meeting of the County Welfare Council to be held February 26th was read to the Council.

The building permit application of Ernest L. Thomas for an auto court for 22 North Cherokee Lane was approved and a variance permit ordered granted allowing the proposed building to be erected not less than four feet from the North property line. This was done on motion of Councilman Riggs, seconded by Councilman Bull.

Business license applications No. 1794 and 1795 were ordered granted and the first mentioned was granted on the proviso the building be made to conform with the laws of the Board of Health.

Councilman Graffigna and Councilman Bull of the special committee appointed February 5th for a recommendation in regard to the leasing of the Lind Airport reported that they recommended that no action be taken until a meeting was had with the Countywide group.

Ordinance No. 271 entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE HOURS OF BUSINESS WHEN, AND THE PLACE OF BUSINESS WHERE, UNCURED AND UNCOOKED MEATS MAY BE SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE, RECEIVED OR DELIVERED, AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH" having been regularly introduced and read at length at the meeting of February 5th was brought up for passage on motion of Councilman Weihe, Councilman Riggs second and second reading omitted by the unanimous consent of the Council. Said ordinance was then finally passed and adopted and ordered to print by the following record vote:

AYES: Councilmen, Weihe, Riggs, Bull, Graffigna, Steele
NOES: Councilmen, None
ABSENT: Councilmen, None

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Councilman Riggs stated that the owners of the Hotel Lodi property desired the City to take care of the waste water from the cooling system to be installed in that building and after some discussion the matter was left up to the City Engineer for his recommendation.

On the suggestion of the Mayor and on motion of Councilman Bull, seconded by Councilman Riggs, the Lodi Stadium was reserved for a football game to be held October 6, 1941 between Stockton and McClatchy High Schools payment for the same to be on the same basis as that now enjoyed by the Lodi Union High School under contract.

Mr. Earl May reported that the roof at fire house No. 1 was in very bad shape and at the direction of the Council the City Engineer was directed to have the same replaced.

Mr. May also reported that the fire alarm horn on trial was not satisfactory to the Fire Department. Superintendent of Public Utilities, John A. Henning stated that he would soon be able to test this horn at a new location.

On motion of Councilman Weihe, seconded by Councilman Graffigna, the fire chief was authorized to purchase the material necessary and have the work done to change over the 1921 Seagrave Fire Truck from solid tires to pneumatic tires.

Councilman Bull reported at length in regard to free swims at Lake Park for children of grammar school age and recommended that the Council proceed in accordance with his recommendations.

Councilman Bull also stated that he had received a very satisfactory price for the purchase of Lot 25 Lake Home Subdivision No. 2 and at the direction of the Mayor this matter was laid over until the next meeting of the Council.


Superintendent of Public Utilities, John A. Henning recommended that the Union Ice Company install its own transformers at their plant at the corner of Main Street and Locust Street and the City allow a rental of \$100.00 per year to the company for the use of these transformers. No action was taken but Mr. Henning was directed to submit his proposal to the Ice Company.


The Clerk was directed to arrange a meeting between Mr. C. W. Campbell of the Public Administration Service and the Council at an early date.
