

City Hall, City of Lodi
Tuesday, July 6th., 1926.

This regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi was called to order by the President at 8.15 o'clock P.M.; Trustees Roach, Shattuck, Weihe and Spooner present, Trustee Hale, absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 21st., 1926 were read, approved as read and so endorsed by the President.

Gio B. Vallergera, representing Lodi Sanitary Scavenger Co. appeared before the Board and applied for an extension of his company's present contract for garbage collection as they desired to purchase additional motor equipment.

On motion of Trustee Shattuck, seconded by Trustee Weihe, and carried unanimously, the President and Clerk of the Board were authorized to cancel the existing contract and enter into a new agreement of the same nature of the present one but for the period of five years from July 1-1926.

Reports of the Marshal and Poundmaster for the month of June were received, read and ordered filed; the report and accompanying inventory of apparatus of the Fire Chief and the Secretary of the Lodi Volunteer Fire Department for the fiscal year were also presented, read and ordered filed.

On motion of Trustee Shattuck, seconded by Trustee Roach, J. E. Baker was appointed relief truck driver for six weeks on recommendation of Fire Chief Stark.

A list of officers elected and appointed by the Lodi Volunteer Fire Department at their last annual meeting was presented to the Board for approval and confirmation. At the order of the President, the Clerk was instructed to ask the officers of the Fire Department to meet with the Board at 8 o'clock P.M. of Monday, July 12th., for consideration of the proposed consolidation of the offices of Fire Chief and Fire Marshal.

Union Ice Company applied for permission to store gasoline in metal tanks beneath the surface of the ground at their distribution plant, Sacramento and Walnut Streets. On motion of Trustee Weihe, seconded by Trustee Shattuck, the permit was ordered granted.

An application from National Audit and Appraisal Company for permission to submit estimates for an audit of the City's accounts was ordered laid over without comment.

On motion of Trustee Shattuck, seconded by Trustee Roach, the Clerk was directed to advertise for sealed proposals for purchase of a light truck for use of the Street Department.

On motion of Trustee Shattuck, seconded by Trustee Weihe, bills in the amount of \$9,417.44 as approved by a majority of the finance committee were ordered paid.

Four building permits aggregating \$2,175.00 were ordered granted.

In the matter of non-payment of bills rendered Lodi Canning Company for use of the City's Sewerage Disposal Plant for additional costs occasioned by discharge of industrial waste; Trustee Shattuck, seconded by Trustee Weihe, moved that the Superintendent of Public Utilities be instructed to shut off any additional facilities in the way of sewer connection that the Canning Company might have for the discharge of such waste within ten days if the bill for such service remained unpaid up to that time. The motion carried.

Trustee Shattuck brought up the matter of the crowded conditions at the Municipal Baths on hot days as regards dressing room space, advocating the installation of locker service as being more compact and assuring patrons of greater safety. After some discussion, Trustee Shattuck moved, seconded by Trustee Weihe that a committee be appointed to confer with the manager of the baths with the intention of installing lockers in part of the dressing rooms and on carriage of the motion, the President appointed Trustees Shattuck, Roach and Weihe to serve.

On motion of Trustee Shattuck, the Board adjourned until 8 o'clock P.M. of Monday, July 12th., 1926.
