

City Hall, City of Lodi  
Tuesday, July 5th., 1927.

This regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi was called to order by the President at 8.12 o'clock P.M. on the above date, Trustees Roach, Weihe and Spooner present, Trustees Hale and Shattuck absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 20th., 1927 were read, approved as read and so endorsed by the President.

On motion of Trustee Roach, seconded by Trustee Weihe, Section 3 of Ordinance 159 was amended to read "Section 3. That said corporation shall construct necessary culverts for the free passage of surface water underneath tracks where requested and all such culverts shall be constructed in accordance with the plans of and subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi and shall replace all existing sewer pipes which may be damaged from the construction, maintenance or operation of said railroad crossings"

Ordinance No. 159 " AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE CENTRAL PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY ( A CORPORATION ) A REVOCABLE PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT TRACKS OF STANDARD GAUGE ACROSS LOCKEFORD AND MAIN STREETS, IN THE CITY OF LODI. " having been regularly introduced at a regular meeting of the Board held June 20th., 1927 and thereat laid over for not less than five days, was introduced as amended in the foregoing by Trustee Weihe with recommendation that the same be passed and adopted and on the call of the roll, said Ordinance No. 159 was passed, adopted and ordered to print by the following vote:-

AYES: Trustees, Weihe, Roach and Spooner.  
NOES: Trustees, None.  
ABSENT: Trustees, Hale and Shattuck.

Ordinance No. 159 was then approved and signed by the President of the Board.

Reports for the month of June from the City Marshal, Poundmaster and Plumbing Inspector were received, read and ordered filed.

A communication from the Fire Chief accompanying inventory of apparatus was also read.

Elmer Tucker Sr. and F. E. Freeman applied by letter for appointment as caretaker of the new City Hall.

C.A. Pratt applied for the position of Park Warden.

On motion of Trustee Weihe, seconded by Trustee Roach, Mr. Frank L. Thomas was employed as inspector on the new City Hall job at a salary of \$200.00 per month.

On motion of Trustee Weihe, seconded by Trustee Roach, the Board decided to install "Majestic" air heaters in the new City Hall, the same to be delivered to City's jobber and furnished through him at a price of \$1,548.00 for the 28 heaters, thermostats included.

Bills in the amount of \$10,139.65 as approved by the Board were allowed and ordered paid.

One building permit in the amount of \$300.00 was granted.

City Engineer Barzellotti reported progress in the opening of South Church Street, recommending that the street be opened all the way from Sturla Street to the north line of Bewley's Suburban Acres.

(Minutes of July 5th. concluded)

Superintendent of Public Utilities, J.A. Henning, reported that the pump used to exhaust water from the municipal baths had been giving trouble and recommended that the motor be raised so that it would be clear of water at all times. He stated that he believed that the motor could be exchanged for one of different type at no cost and that the pit could be deepened at a cost of about \$50.00. At the order of the Board Mr. Henning was authorized to make the change within the cost limits stated.

On motion of Trustee Weihe, seconded by Trustee Roach, the Board adjourned until the date of their next regular meeting, July 18th., 1927.
