The City Council met at 8.17 o'clock P.M. on the above date, all members present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 7th., 1928 were read, approved as read and so endorsed by the Mayor.

Mr Christian Rageth addressed the Council stating that he had finished the planting of Lawrence Park and now left it in the care of the City.

The City Clerk was directed to write the Board of High School Trustees in regard to the dangerous condition prevailing at Oak & Rose Streets on account of the rose hedge on the High School grounds, also, to have the Superintendent of Streets install a "STOP" sign for this intersection.

Mr John Holman offered \$500.00 for the house on the Library lot, $\frac{1}{2}$ cash, the balance on December 31st., 1928. This offer was taken under consideration.

William B. Collier, Wayne Wilson and Arthur T. Welton applied for appointments in the Fire Department.


Three building permits totalling \$6,900 were allowed.

On motion of Councilman, Hale, Roach second, bills in the amount of \$3,918.19 as approved by the Finance Committee were allowed and ordered paid.


The Clerk was again directed to communicate with California Co-operative Producers in regard to their intentions in the disposal of cannery waste.
