

City Hall, City of Lodi
Monday, June 4th, 1928.

The City Council of the City of Lodi met in regular session at 8.04 o'clock P.M., Councilmen Hale, Roach, Shattuck, Weine and Spooner present, (Councilman Weine appeared and took his seat at 8.07 o'clock P.M.)

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 21st and the adjourned regular meeting of May 28, 1928 were read, approved as read and so endorsed by the Mayor.

The order of Public Hearings was passed by unanimous consent and the Council proceeded to open and canvass the proposals received on additions to the Library. After consideration of the proposals, award was made by the passage of:-

- RESOLUTION NO. 548 -
RESOLUTION OF AWARD - LIBRARY ADDITIONS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lodi did, in open session, and at a regular meeting of said Council, on Monday, the 4th day of June, 1928, publicly open, examine and declare all sealed proposals for doing the following work in said City, to-wit :

Addition to Public Library Located at Lodi, California, in accordance with the plans & specifications therefore as prepared by Davis-Pearce Company and adopted by the City Council April 23rd, 1928.

RESOLVED, that the said City Council hereby rejects all of said bids or proposals, except that next herein mentioned, and hereby awards the contract for doing said work to the lowest responsible bidder, to-wit, to E. T. WISNER, of Lodi, California, at the price named in his bid submitted as aforesaid.

RESOLVED, also, that, in accordance with the specifications and with the bid or proposal accepted, this City Council elects to reject that part of said bid or proposal in-so-far as the same relates to alternates numbers 5, 6 and 8, said alternates to be omitted from the contract, and awards the contract as covering the following items as listed in the bid or proposal accepted, viz :-

For General Contract, the sum of	\$ 19,753.00
Alternate No. 1. in addition thereto,	1,175.00
Alternate No. 2	505.00
Alternate No. 3	315.00
Alternate No. 4	250.00
Alternate No. 7	257.00
Alternate No. 9	584.00

The total amount of the contract awarded herein being the sum of TWENTY TWO THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED FORTY NINE DOLLARS, (\$22,649.00).

The City Clerk is hereby directed to return the bidding deposits of all unsuccessful bidders within three days, retaining that of the successful bidders until he shall have executed a proper contract acceptable to the City Attorney and the Mayor of this City together with the bonds in such cases required by law or ordinance.

The foregoing Resolution No. 548 was then passed and adopted by the following vote:-

Hotel Noble applied by letter and orally for allotment of parking space for California Transit Company's stages on the north side of Elm Street east of Sacramento Street; on motion of Councilman Weihe, Shattuck second, the application was tabled awaiting application of the Transit Company and further investigation.

Mr Briggs E. Porter protested against an additional water charge at his place at 116 N. Washington Street. Referred to the City Clerk.

Monthly reports from the City Plumbing Inspector, the Chief of Police and the Poundmaster were read and ordered filed.

Plans and specifications for furniture and equipment for Lodi Public Library were adopted by the passage of Resolution No. 549 by the following vote:-

Mr Geo. S. Long, 408 South Sacramento Street, Lodi, applied for the position of custodian of the Public Dump Grounds, guaranteeing to take 75% of the premises in a satisfactory manner for salvage of materials from the dump and in addition thereto, to pay the City twenty-five dollars a year from the proceeds. The proposal was accepted and Mr Long employed to date from July 1, 1928 by the passage of Resolution No. 550 :-

- RESOLUTION NO. 550 -

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Lodi, that Mr George S. Long be employed as custodian of the City's dumping grounds on the Mokelumne River east of the Southern Pacific bridge, his compensation to be secured by himself from the salvage of waste materials less the sum of twenty-five dollars annually which shall be paid to the City.

This employment shall date from July 1, 1928 and shall terminate June 30, 1931 unless terminated prior to the last named date by order of the City Council.

Mr. Delaney of the H.V. Carter Company addressed the Council in regard to power lawn mowers; the City Clerk was directed, on motion of Councilman Shattuck, Weihe second, to prepare specifications and advertise for a power mower.

The Clerk read a letter from Pacific Coast Building Officials Conference advocating the adoption of their standard building code.

Four building permits aggregating \$3,700.00 were granted.

On motion of Councilman Shattuck, Roach second, the Clerk was directed to procure one Fyr Fyter fire extinguisher for use at the baths.

Bills in the amount of \$9,118.76 as approved by the Finance Committee were allowed and ordered paid on motion of Councilman Shattuck, Roach second.

Ordinance No. 162, " AN ORDINANCE SEPARATING THE DUTIES OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS OF THE CITY OF LODI AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE COMPENSATIONS" was read and ~~was~~ formally introduced. Motion Shattuck, Roach second.

Ordinance No. 163, " AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 21 OF THE CITY OF LODI, ENTITLED ' AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF LODI AND TO PROVIDE FOR BETTER PROTECTION AGAINST FIRES THEREIN ' " having been regularly introduced at an adjourned meeting of the City Council held May 28th, 1928, and more than five days having elapsed since the said introduction, was introduced for final reading and adoption on motion of Councilman Weihe, Roach second, and

passed adopted and approved by the following vote:-

The Mayor then endorsed his approval thereon and the ordinance was ordered to print.

Ordinance No. 164, " AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR




The Mayor then endorsed his approval thereon.
