

Council Chambers-City Hall
City of Lodi
Monday, November 3, 1930

Regular meeting- Called to order at 8.04 o'clock P.M.
Councilmen Keagle, Roach, Steele, Weihe and Spooner (Mayor),
present, none absent.

Minutes of last regular meeting held October 20th., 1930
read, approved as read and so endorsed by the Mayor.

The order of public hearings was passed and the City Council
proceeded to hear communications and reports. Chief of Police
Christesen filed the resignation of Arthur Earl Blewett to take
effect November 30th., 1930 and at the same time presented the
application of Clarence Stonewall Jackson for appointment to
the vacancy, recommending that the resignation be accepted and
that Mr Jackson be appointed. On motion of Councilman Steele,
Keagle second, the recommendations of the Chief of Police were
confirmed and Mr Jackson appointed at the usual salary and
allowance allowed police officers.

Reports of the Chief of Police and of the Poundmaster for
the month of October were received, read and ordered filed.

The Clerk read a letter from Hartford Relief Corps voicing
appreciation of the City's help in erecting a monument to deceased
soldiers of the War of the Rebellion.

Miss Daisy Place requested that Church Street be opened
so as to obtain admittance to her property near its southern
terminal.

On motion, the Clerk was directed to pay taxes due in
Calaveras and Amador Counties.

Bill E. Wiley appeared before the City Council and asked
that the City share in the cost of bringing Mr Carl Dean Thomp-
son to Lodi for an address on municipal ownership. The sum of
\$12.50 from the advertising fund was so appropriated.

Bills in the amount of \$10,760.84 as approved by the Finance
Committee were ordered paid.

The City Council then adjourned on motion of Councilman
Keagle.
