At the call of the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Lodi met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. on the date first above written, Councilmen Clark, Spooner, Weihe and Mayor Steele present, Councilman Keagle absent, it being reported that he was still too ill to leave his residence.


Mayor Steele stated that this meeting had been called in regard to the Emergency Relief Administration project for constructing a building suitable for use of the local unit of the California National Guard. It appeared from conversations with the S.E.R.A. authorities that this project would have to be completed in usable units in order to make the construction period less than thirteen weeks, which is the limit now set for S.E.R.A. projects. Captain Charles White of the local National Guard Battery was present and stated that completion of the principal part of the building would accommodate the battery and Mr D. D. Smith, of the Lodi District Chamber of Commerce assured the Council that there would be no doubt but that the S.E.R.A. would grant supplementary applications until the building was complete.

On motion of Councilman Spooner, Clark second, Resolution No. 767 authorizing modification of the City's filed application for a project to construct an armory building so that the main part of the building would be erected at this time was introduced and read at length. The said Resolution No. 767 was thereupon passed and adopted by the following vote:-


AYES: Councilmen, Spooner, Clark, Weihe and Mayor Steele.
