Monday, December 2, 1935

The City Council of the City of Lodi met in regular meeting at 8:00 o'clock P. M. on the date first above written. Councilmen Clark, Graffigna, Spooner and Weihe, present. Mayor Steele, absent. On motion of Councilman Weihe, seconded by Councilman Graffigna, Councilman Clark was chosen Mayor Protem and opened the meeting.

The minutes of the meeting of November 18, 1935 were read, and approved as read and so indorsed by the Mayor.

A petition signed by several residents in the vicinity of the 500 block of Flora and Hilborn Streets asking for the abatement of a nuisance to-wit:- the keeping of a cow under unsanitary conditions, was ordered referred to the health and police departments by the Mayor.

The Clerk presented a letter written by the Bureau of Sanitary Engineering of the State of California to Dr. John J. Sippy of the San Joaquin Local Health District, in regard to the condition of the effluent from the Plant.

Mr. F. T. Boyd of Los Angeles applied by letter for appointment as consulting engineer in the construction of the Proposed Hydro-electric Plant. Application ordered filed.

In the matter of tax liens against the lands received in the settlement of the Lawrence Estate, generally known as the Pioneer Part, the Mayor was directed to file a petition with the Board of Supervisors asking that the said taxes be cancelled. This was done by the adoption of Resolution No. 817 by the following vote:

RESOLUTION 817

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PETITION TO THE BOARD
OF SUPERVISORS FOR THE CANCELLATION OF TAXES

WHEREAS, this City acquired certain lands in the Lawrence Homestead Addition to Lodi by virtue of a certain annexed decree of distribution, recorded November 7, 1934 in the office of the County Recorder of San Joaquin County, California, said lands being particularly described as follows:-

A tract of land situated in the County of San Joaquin, State of California, and being a portion of "Map No. 2, Lawrence Homestead Addition," filed August 10, 1922, in Book of Maps, Vol. 10, page 59, San Joaquin County Records, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at an iron pipe at the intersection of the East line of Stockton Street with the North line of Lawrence Avenue as shown on said Map No. 2 of Lawrence Homestead Addition; thence S 89°06' E along the North line of Lawrence Ave., 946.43 ft; thence N 0°37' E 711.82 ft; thence N 89°06' W 895.63 ft. to a point in the East line of Stockton Street; thence along the East line of Stockton Street, S 4°42' W 713.4 ft. to the point of beginning, and containing 15.05 acres.

and,

WHEREAS, the lien for county taxes attached to the same on the first Monday of March, 1935 in accordance with law said lands were assessed by the County Assessor and the State Board of Equalization under the following description, to-wit:-

Lawrence Homestead Addition, Map No. 2. Portion of Lots 21 and 22 and all of Lots 29 and 30.

at an assessed valuation of \$2,440.00 and subsequently to said assessment a tax of \$63.18 was levied upon said land by the County Board of Supervisors all in time, form and manner as required by statute and the Constitution of this State, and;

WHEREAS, said lands now being property of this City and not subject to sale for delinquent taxes, and said lands having been incorporated within the City Limits of the City of Lodi on the 29th day of March, 1935 are not now subject to taxes for county purposes;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor of this City be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, to petition the Board of Supervisors (by and with the consent of the District Attorney) to cancel said tax in the amount of \$63.18 in accordance with Section 3804-a of the Political Code of this State.

The report of the Poundmaster for the Month of November and that of the Chief of Police for the same period were received, read and ordered filed.

Ordinance No. 215, entitled "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CERTAIN ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES AND ESTABLISHING RATES FOR THE SALE OF ELECTRIC ENERGY BY THE CITY OF LODI" having been regularly introduced at the regular meeting of November 18, 1935 and thereat laid over for the statutory period of not less than five days was introduced for passage on motion of Councilman Weihe, seconded by Councilman Graffigna, the said Ordinance was then finally passed, adopted and ordered to print by the following vote:-

AYES: COUNCILMEN, Weihe, Graffigna, Spooner and Clark
NOES: COUNCILMEN, NONE
ABSENT: COUNCILMAN, Steele

The acting Mayor then approved and signed the Ordinance.

Five building permits for structures to cost \$3,100.00 were allowed and ordered granted on motion of Councilman Weihe, seconded by Councilman Graffigna.

Councilman Weihe of the Street Committee reported that he had met with the committee from the Lodi Business Men's Association and that they had reached the conclusion that all trucks and loads exceeding 17 ft. in length would be requested to park parallel to the curb in all places in the City where parallel parking is permitted.

On motion of Councilman Weihe, seconded by Councilman Graffigna, the Clerk was authorized to connect water and light services at the Community Toy Pile to be opened at 120 West Pine Street during the Holiday Season. All charges to be cancelled.

Mr. C. O. Henning, acting City Engineer, addressed the Council in regard to a proposal received from Stuart S. Smith in regard to the rental of the City's Elgin Sweeper. On Motion of Councilman Spooner seconded by Councilman Graffigna, Mr. Henning and the City Clerk were authorized to enter into a rental contract for the use of the sweeper and also ascertain if the same could be sold at a reasonable price.

Bills in the amount of \$6,511.23 as approved by the Finance Committee were ordered paid on motion of Councilman Spooner, Weihe second. Said bills include claims No. 25103 to 25200 inclusive.


