Monday, August 17, 1936

The City Council of the City of Lodi met in regular session on Monday, August 17, 1936 at 8:00 o'clock P. M., Councilmen, Clark, Graffigna, Spooner, Weina and Steele present; none absent.

The minutes of the meeting of August 3, 1936 were read, approved as read and so indorsed by the Mayor.

Dr. W. J. Coffield, Secretary of the Lodi Library Board and Miss Amy L. Boynton, Librarian appeared and presented the proposed library budget for the fiscal year 1936-1937. On order of the Mayor it was ordered filed to be considered at the time when the Council should adopt the general budget.

Mr. J.C.F. Burson addressed the Council in regards to the necessity of annexing the Southerly part of the Lodi Barnhart Tract to the City. He was informed that the City Attorney and City Clerk would prepare legal petitions to be circulated at an early date.

A letter was received from the Lodi-Japanese-American Citizen's League inviting the Council to send representatives to their inaugural meeting to be held on August 28, 1936 at 8:00 o'clock P.M. The Clerk was directed to acknowledge receipt of the communication and inform the Secretary of this association that the Council would have a representative present.

The Clerk read the call for the annual convention of the League of California Municipalities to be held at Santa Monica, September 9, 10, 11, and 12 and stated that he had a supply of identification certificates available for the use of delegates.

13 building permits Nos. 1517 to 1529 for structures to cost \$5225.00 were allowed and ordered granted. Application No. 1523 for additions to the Star Restaurant at 29 North Sacramento Street was referred to the City Engineer's Department as the structure did not seem to conform to the restrictions on buildings in that locality.


Claims Nos. 27040 to and including 27136 in the amount of \$10,536.20 were allowed and ordered paid on motion of Councilman Spooner, seconded by Councilman Graffigna.

On motion of Councilman Spooner, the City Council adjourned to the day and date of its next regular meeting to be held September 8, 1936 as the first Monday in September will be a holiday.
