

COUNCIL CHAMBERS--CITY COUNCIL
CITY HALL -- CITY OF LODI

Tuesday, December 7, 1937

The City Council of the City of Lodi met in adjourned regular meeting at 8:00 o'clock P.M. of Tuesday, December 7, 1937. Councilmen Clark, Graffigna, Weihe and Steele present, Councilman Spooner, absent.

Mr. Frank A. Henning addressed the Council in regard to notice served on the owner and lessee of "Martin's Campground" that it did not conform with the state housing law. Mr. Henning stated that the parties interested would be willing to make any changes required by law if informed just what these changes should be.

The Clerk read a letter from the League of California Municipalities in regard to the expenditure of moneys received from liquor licenses. Communication ordered filed.

On motion of Councilmen Graffigna, seconded by Councilman Weihe, Resolution No. 937 was introduced, read by the clerk and considered by the Council.

RESOLUTION NO. 937

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Lodi, County of San Joaquin, State of California:-

That all street or highway work hereafter performed in this City, the cost of which is to be paid from gasoline tax moneys, shall be done in accordance with the "STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS" of the Department of Public Works, Division of Highways of the State of California, edition of January, 1935 and amendments thereto as approved and issued by the said Department of Public Works; this City Council hereby adopts said "STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS" as the specifications of the City of Lodi for street and highway work;

It shall be sufficient, in all applications for authority to expend gasoline tax moneys and in all contracts and agreements between this City and the State of California and between this City and private contractors, to refer to the said specifications as the specifications for the work under the name "STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS OF THE DIVISION OF HIGHWAYS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA";

On any work where deviation from these specifications is to be permitted, such deviation shall appear by note in all resolutions and be displayed in the plans and contracts together with the certificate of the approval of such deviations made by the Department of Public Works, Division of Highways.

Plans, cross section diagrams and construction details for Standard Structures conforming to said Standard Specifications of the Division of Highways and prepared by said Division may be made part of any proceeding or contract by reference to identification indices placed thereon by the Division of Highways.

The foregoing Resolution No. 937 was then passed and adopted by the assenting votes of Councilmen Graffigna, Weihe, Clark and Steele. Absent Councilman Spooner.

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Mr. J. H. Welch applied by letter for the position of Building Inspector if and when the job was created.

The report of the Chief of Police for the month of November and that of the Poundmaster for the same period were received, read and ordered filed.

On recommendation of Mr. J. A. Henning, Superintendent of Public Utilities the Mayor was authorized to sign a letter transferring the Mazda Lamp contract from E. S. Hook to Emery and Brown for the balance of its term.

Four business licenses No. 8542 to and including 8545 were allowed and ordered granted.

On motion of Councilman Graffigna, seconded by Councilman Weihe, the Mayor was authorized to execute a contract for the purchase of liquid chlorine with the Great Western Electro-Chemical Company, such contract to expire on December 31, 1933.

Mr. J. A. Henning addressed the Council in regard to the condition of Ed Emery injured some weeks ago in the electrical department.

The proposal of Mr. E. A. Benedict to sell the City the old Armory site for the sum of \$6,000.00 was rejected.

The City Clerk reported that the sum of \$1,728.03 was still uncollected on account of curbs and gutter assessments made on account of work done under W.P.A. proceedings. Mayor Steele stated that the uncollected accounts should be referred to the City Attorney for such action as he might find necessary.

On motion of Councilman Weihe, seconded by Councilman Clark, Superintendent of Public Utilities, Mr. J. A. Henning was authorized to connect up the Christmas decorations provided by the Lodi Business Men's Association to the City circuits. Mr. Henning's estimate of the cost of labor, material and electric current was \$175.00.

Applications for building permits No. 1838 to and including No. 1862 were read by the Clerk as filed and on motion of Councilman Graffigna, seconded by Councilman Weihe the same were allowed with the exception of No. 1862, the latter application being for a commercial building in a residential district, making a net of twenty-four permits granted for structures to cost an approximate amount of \$34,170.

Claims No. 30441 to and including No. 30623 in the total amount of \$29,046.64 were allowed and ordered paid on motion of Councilman Clark, seconded by Councilman Graffigna.

On the recommendation of Councilman Graffigna and by his motion, seconded by Councilman Weihe, Mr. M. R. Channell was appointed relief driver in the Fire Department effective December 1, 1937 at a monthly salary of \$130.00, said salary to include the sum now allowed for fire inspection.


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On motion of Councilman Weihe, the City Council
