

City Hall, Lodi, Cal., February 5, 1919.

In regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi there were present Trustees Black, Hale, Keeney, Crose and Montgomery.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Building and removal permits were granted as follows:
C.N.Cable, to move building from 18 South School street to location outside city.
E. D. Warriner, addition to porch at 12 South Hutchins street.
N.W.Zauble, dwelling N $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot 33, Barnhart Tract.
N.W.Zauble, poultry house, N $\frac{1}{2}$ lot 33, Barnhart Tract.
Lodi Canning Co., building for cannery on lots 70 and 71, Lodi Barnhart Tract.
Mrs. N.A.Lind, dwelling, lot 20, block 11, Barnhart Tract.
Denny Main, lavatory, lot 14, block 49, Briar & Keeney Addition.
Friedberger Estate Co., addition to store, lot 5, block 15, City of Lodi.
Miles S. Frost, dwelling portion of lot 57, Barnhart Tract.
F.G.Cary, to remodel front at 15 and 17 West Pine Street.
E.S.Clark, poultry house, 21 South Hutchins street.
Geo. L. Meissner, store building, 18 South School street.

In the matter of the opening of a street to connect North School street and North Church street at the northern City Limits H. B. Coleman and the Sanguinetti Estate proposed to sell to the City a strip of land sixty feet wide for such opening. After discussion the matter was laid over to be taken up at an adjourned meeting later.

A communication was received from the Southern Pacific Company stating they would be willing to place one electrolier on the north side of East Walnut street between Main street and the Southern Pacific tracks.

Reports of City Marshal, City Treasurer and City Plumbing Inspector were read and ordered filed.

In the matter of the application of B. Greer and J.M.Greer for a permit to operate a motor vehicle as a common carrier on the streets of Lodi, Trustee Keeney moved, second by Trustee Montgomery, that a permit be denied. The motion was adopted by unanimous vote of the Board.

J. C. Bawley presented a petition of property owners asking that the alley running east and west from North Lee Avenue to Hutchins street in the block between Pine and Elm streets, be paved. The matter was laid over to be taken up in connection with the proposed improvement of Lee Avenue.

In the matter of closing hours for pool and billiard halls and bowling alleys the following agreement was filed with the Board:

Upon motion of Trustee Keeney, seconded by Trustee Crose, the foregoing agreement was accepted and ordered filed.

Trustee Keeney moved, seconded by Trustee Crose, that in view of the agreement to close billiard and pool rooms and bowling alleys as above, that all proceedings regarding proposed Ordinance No. 105 be revoked and all documents except the foregoing agreement be stricken from the files. The motion was carried unanimously.

Amended petition asking for the improvement of Locust street was filed by F. P. Roper.

Bills amounting to \$482.15 were allowed and ordered paid.

Upon motion the Board adjourned to meet again at 8 o'clock p. m., Wednesday, February 5, 1919.
