

City Hall, Lodi, Cal., Sept. 6, 1920.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi convened in regular session at 8 o'clock p.m., there being present Trustees Montgomery, Rich and Hale. Absent Trustees Hickok and Crose.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

This being the time designated by law for fixing the tax rate the following ordinance was introduced for passage:

ORDINANCE NO. 114.

"An Ordinance Levying Taxes in the year 1920 in Provision of Revenue for the fiscal year beginning July 1st, 1921."

Upon motion of Trustee Rich, seconded by Trustee Hale, the foregoing ordinance was adopted by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Rich, Hale and Montgomery.

Noes: None.

Absent: Trustees Crose and Hickok.

The tax rate having been fixed as required by law and this date being a legal holiday, the Board upon motion of Trustee Hale, seconded by Trustee Rich, adjourned until 8 o'clock p.m., Tuesday, September 7th, 1920.
