

Municipal Building, Lodi, Cal., June 30, 1914

The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi convened in adjourned session at 1:30 p. m. President Hale presided and all members were present.

The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved.

It being shown that all requirements had been complied with the matter of a saloon license applied for by Martin D. Duffy was taken up. Upon motion of Keeney, seconded by Black, the license was granted by the following vote: Ayes-Keeney, Black, Deaver, Folendorf, Hale. Noes-None.

In the matter of the application of R. M. Combs for a saloon license, all requirements having been complied with, it was moved by Deaver, seconded by Folendorf, that the license be granted, which motion was carried by the following vote: Ayes-Deaver, Folendorf, Keeney, Black, Hale. Noes-None.

The application of A. F. Kavanaugh for a saloon license was taken up and on motion of Keeney, seconded by Deaver, the license was granted with the proviso that the work of remodeling the building where the business is to be carried on should be completed within thirty days. Roll call upon the above question resulted as follows: Ayes-Keeney, Deaver, Hale, Black, Folendorf. Noes-None.

Upon motion of Folendorf, seconded by Black, a wholesale liquor license was granted to Lodi Soda-Works & Ice Depot, by the affirmative votes of Folendorf, Black, Keeney, Deaver and Hale.

Upon motion of Deaver, seconded by Keeney, a wholesale liquor license was granted to Wilkinson & Wilkinson by the affirmative votes of Deaver, Keeney, Black Folendorf and Hale.

Upon motion of Folendorf, seconded by Keeney, a wholesale liquor license was granted to C. J. Bender upon the affirmative votes of Folendorf, Keeney, Black, Deaver and Hale.

Upon motion of Black, seconded by Folendorf, a wholesale liquor license was granted to Jacob G. Hieb upon the affirmative votes of Black, Folendorf, Hale, Keeney, Deaver.

The application of Paul D. Snowalter for a license to conduct a saloon at 103 East Pine street was read and filed.

Building permits granted:

A. F. Kavanaugh, to remodel building at 27 North Sacramento St.  
W. D. Voorhies & Son, to repair and build addition to Salem school building.

The bond of W. H. Lorenz, as City Treasurer, was accepted as corrected.

The Clerk was directed to communicate with the Gamewell Fire Alarm Company notifying them that the fire alarm system supplied by them to the City of Lodi was not giving satisfaction; and to also state that while we are receiving inquiries from other cities in regard to the apparatus we cannot consistently recommend their system.

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried President of the Board Hale was authorized to renew the annual Multiple Transformer contract with the General Electric Company which expires July 1, 1914.

Claims for labor amounting to \$920.65 were allowed and ordered paid.

Ordinance No. 79, dealing with matters pertaining to Health and Sanitation was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Representative Braslan, of the Neptune Meter Company of New York, explained to the Board the advantages of his company's water meters.

The Board adjourned.
