

Municipal Building, Lodi, Cal., July 6, 1914.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi met in regular session at 8:00 p.m., President Hale presiding and all members present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Building permits were granted as follows:

W. D. Voorhies & Son, to remodel front of Ferguson & Babel building at 19 North Sacramento street.

O.A. Shroeder, to construct a building on Salem School grounds.

Bare Fruit Company, to construct addition to fruit shed at the corner of Pine and Main streets.

F. L. Church, to construct poultry house on Lot 27, Lodi Barnhart Tract.

F. G. Cary, to remodel Friedberger-Blodgett building, Corner Sacramento and Pine streets.

Upon motion regularly made seconded and carried, unanimously, F. G. Cary was granted permission to enclose the sidewalk at the corner of Pine and Sacramento streets for a period of not to exceed thirty days while remodeling the Friedberger-Blodgett building.

Reports of Plumbing Inspector Henning, Marshal Coleman, City Treasurer Lorenz, and City Engineer Barzellotti were read and ordered filed.

The Lodi Investment Company was granted permission to use dynamite for removing concrete at the new hotel site, corner of Pine and School streets, such work to be under supervision of the City Marshal.

S. W. Hopkins appeared before the Board with the suggestion that owners on South Sacramento street should be required to have constructed in front of their properties concrete sidewalks, and recommended that the Board, by ordinance on resolution, demand that such work be done. The matter was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Ordinance No. 79, entitled "An Ordinance Prescribing the Duties of Physicians and Others Having the Care of the Sick; Establishing Certain Rules for the Prevention of Disease; Regulating the Sale of Milk and Other Foods; Providing For Executive Health Officer; Prescribing Rules for the Collection of Manure, Offal and Rubbish; and Providing For the Carrying Out of a System of Sanitation for the City of Lodi," was read and upon motion was placed upon passage.

The application of Frank Matsumoto for a license to sell liquor with meals at his hotel at 20 North Main street, was referred back as it was not accompanied by a bond and was otherwise complete as it did not bear the recommendation of the owners of a majority of the frontage on the block.

The petition of John Bauer and others for an alley from Pleasant Avenue to Hutchins street, between and parallel with West Locust and West Lockford streets, was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

The matter of providing sewer service for the Bare Fruit Company and the Earl Fruit Company was placed in charge of Superintendent Henning with instructions to proceed with the work in such manner as in his judgment was deemed proper.

The claim of P. A. Dougherty & Son for a rebate of \$1.80 on a water bill was not allowed.

Miscellaneous claims amounting to \$2384.09 were allowed and ordered paid.

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried, the salary of Garnet Griffith, engineer at the water works, was increased from \$85 to \$100 per month effective July 1, 1914.

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried, the salary of Deputy City Clerk Effie Florence was increased from \$60 to \$75 per month, effective July 1, 1914.

The application of Mrs. F. B. Whyers for a reduction in water rate, which was referred to the Committee of the Whole June 17th was, upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried, not granted.

Upon motion of Chairman Deaver of the Finance Committee the bonds of City Marshal and City Clerk were fixed at \$3000.

The Clerk was instructed to write the City Street Improvement Company with a request to be informed as to what steps that company is taking toward the paving of East Pine street for which permission had been granted some time previously.

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried, the Board adjourned to reconvene at 7:30 p.m. Monday, July 13, 1914.
