

Municipal Building, Lodi, Cal. Sept. 8, 1914.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi convened in regular session at 8:00 p.m., all members present. President of the Board Hale presided.

The minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

The following building permits were granted:

F. L. Cornwell, corrugated iron roof in rear of No. 123 North Sacramento street. This permit was granted with the proviso that the Marshal and Fire Chief approve the construction.

W. S. Robbins, new roof at his residence, 108 East Walnut.

M. H. Rodacker, addition to building on lot 3, block 7, Barnhart Tract.

T. Moon, addition to building at 313 Tokay St., Barnhart Tract.

T. J. Thurmond, building at 404 East Elm Street.

S. W. McClary, private garage on lot 15, block 27, Lodi.

Privileges to store and sell gasoline within the city limits were granted to Jules Perrin and P. S. Jacks.

Reports of City Marshal Coleman and Plumbing Inspector Hennig were read and ordered filed.

Communications were received and filed from F. W. Guail, county surveyor, regarding paving East Pine street and Cherokee Lane intersection; Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, in regard to securing officer at night; Public Service Bureau of Berkeley offering legal services; and League of California Municipalities, calling attention to the convention to be held at Del Monte beginning October 12, 1914.

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried, the City Clerk was delegated to represent the city at the convention above mentioned.

Supplement No. 3 to Agreement of November 7th, 1910, between The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company and the City of Lodi, covering one-half ownership in 289 poles at various locations as agreed upon by filed check made March 6, 1914, was received and upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried the same was accepted. The Clerk was instructed to submit bill for two poles,

one at Lodi Avenue and alley between Hitchins street and Lee avenue, and one at southeast corner of Pine and Grand streets, which it is incumbent upon the Telephone Company to purchase a one-half interest at \$7.50 each.

ORDINANCE NO. 81,

Entitled, "An Ordinance Levying Taxes in the Year 1914 in Provision of Revenue For the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 1915," was given final reading and upon motion of Trustee Keeney, seconded by Trustee Black, was adopted by the following vote: Ayes: Black, Keeney, Deaver, Polendorf and Hale. Nays: None. Absent: None.

The appointment and oath of office of Deputy Marshal G.E. Seibert were read and upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried the appointment was confirmed.

Claims against the city amounting to \$3401.02 were presented and upon motion the item of \$8.05, covering premium on City Clerk's bond, in the claim of E.M. Keeney, was not allowed. The balance of the claims amounting to \$3392.97 were allowed and ordered paid.

Upon motion of Trustee Black, seconded by Trustee Deaver, the salary of the Health Officer was increased from \$20 to \$30 per month and the salary of the Secretary of the Board of Health was fixed at \$10 per month.

Upon the suggestion of Trustee Deaver it was decided to require the Marshal and deputies to wear their stars in full view; also to call attention of all officers to the frequent violation of the ordinance against operating motor cycles in the city with mufflers open.

A motion was regularly made, seconded and carried, instructing the Clerk to credit the water and light account of the Lodi Public Library \$125; this to be in lieu of the increased ~~xxxxxx~~ appropriation asked for by the library board.

It was moved by Trustee Polendorf, seconded by Trustee Deaver, that the petition of property owners on East Pine street, from Main street to Cherokee street, requesting the city to install sixteen three-light electroliers; be granted provided the petitioners secure and collect subscriptions to the amount of \$448, such amount to be paid to the city. The motion was unanimously carried.

It was moved, seconded and carried, that Superintendent Hanning be authorized to purchase the necessary material and provide for the wiring in double circuit of all electroliers to be later installed on East Pine street.

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried Superintendent Hanning was authorized to purchase from the General Electric Company, fifty Type I-10 electric meters at \$5.20 each.
