

Municipal Building, Lodi, Cal., April 17, 1916

The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi convened in regular session at 8:00 p. m. There were present Trustees Hale, Black, Folendorf, Keeney and Deaver.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Upon motion regularly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the compensation of election officers serving at the election of April 10th, 1916, was fixed at \$5.00 each.

The returns of the election held in the city of Lodi on the above date were canvassed and the result declared by the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION,  
DECLARING RESULT OF THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL  
ELECTION HELD APRIL 10, 1916.

WHEREAS, A General Municipal Election was held in the City of Lodi, State of California, on Monday, the Tenth day of April, 1916, for the purpose of electing two members of the Board of Trustees; a Clerk and ex-officio Assessor; a Treasurer; and a Board of Fifteen Freeholders, to frame a charter for the City of Lodi; and to vote upon the following propositions:

Proposition No. 1.- Shall the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi construct a Municipal Swimming Tank, at a cost not exceeding \$6000?

Proposition No. 2.- Shall the City of Lodi acquire, maintain and operate a Municipal Street Paving Plant?

AND WHEREAS, It appears that said election was held and conducted in accordance with the general election laws of the State, so far as the same were applicable; and that the Board of Trustees gave such notice of election as prescribed by ordinance, and appointed Boards of Election, fixed their compensation and established election precincts and polling places; and that said election was held and conducted and the votes cast thereat were received and canvassed and returns thereon made in time, form and manner as required by law;

AND WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi did meet on this, the Seventeenth day of April, 1916, being the Monday next succeeding the date of said General Municipal Election, for the purpose of canvassing the vote cast thereat, whereupon it was found that the vote cast at said election in the respective precincts established therefor was as follows:

That Proposition No. 1, having received 470 affirmative and 442 negative votes, was carried in the affirmative.  
 That Proposition No. 2, having received 625 affirmative and 294 negative votes, was carried in the affirmative.

The Clerk and the Treasurer, respectively, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, shall execute a bond to the City of Iodi, in such sum as required by ordinance, which bonds shall be approved by the Board of Trustees; the bond of the Treasurer shall be filed with the Clerk; the bond of the Clerk shall be filed with the President of the Board.

All newly elected officers before entering upon the duties of the offices to which they have been elected, shall take and subscribe to the constitutional oath of office, and file the same with the Clerk.

Trustee Deaver moved the adoption of the resolution as read, which was seconded by Trustee Folendorf. The motion was carried by the following vote:  
 Ayes-Trustees Black, Keeney, Deaver, Folendorf and Hale.  
 Nays- None.

The report of the City Clerk for the quarter ending March 31, 1916, was read and ordered filed.

The application of W. Boden for employment as driver of a street sprinkling wagon was read and ordered filed.

J. H. Bowling's application for the position of tree warden was read and ordered filed.

A permit was granted to Otto Weine to construct addition to a building at 15 West Locust street.

Miscellaneous claims amounting to \$336.22 were allowed and ordered paid.

Upon motion of Trustee Black the Board adjourned sine die.
