

Municipal Building, Lodi, Cal., Apr. 2, 1917.

In regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi there were present Trustees Hale, Black, Keeney, Deaver and Polendorf.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Building permits were granted to W.R. Kaney, storage room at 224 North Grand Avenue; J.A. Klaassen, private stable at 445 Tokay St.; H.E. Welch, private garage at 415 West Pine St.,

The application of Crose & Marling for permit to construct addition to a building used as a restaurant on lot 6, block 23, was laid on the table indefinitely.

A.B. Hoag was granted permission to install an underground storage tank for gasoline at his garage on lot 9, block 17, on South Sacramento street.

Reports of the City Marshal and the City Poundmaster for the month of March were read and ordered filed.

The report of City Treasurer Lorenz for the quarter ending March 31st was read and ordered filed.

The application of D.N. Whittaker for increase of \$10 per month pay was taken under advisement.

A communication received from the Cal. League of Municipalities explained the purpose of Assembly Bill No. 697, which provides for the publication of ordinances not less than three times in a newspaper, and urged the City to protest against the same becoming a law. Trustee Polendorf moved, seconded by Trustee Keeney, that the Board concur in the views of the League and that the President of the Board be authorized to wire the Governor and our representatives in the Legislature the attitude of the City of Lodi on this question. The motion carried unanimously.

The Board upon motion authorized President of the Board Hale to execute the usual annual transformer contract with General Electric Company.

Trustee Black moved, seconded by Trustee Polendorf, that inasmuch as in the opinion of the Board City Scavenger G.D. Langley has not fulfilled his contract with the City his services be discontinued immediately. The motion carried unanimously.

Upon motion the City Marshal was requested to appoint as a Deputy Marshal J.C. Ferguson, Manager of the Municipal Baths.

Miscellaneous bills against the City amounting to \$4723.86 were allowed and ordered paid.

The Board adjourned.
