

Municipal Building, Lodi, California, Sep. 10, 1912.

In adjourned regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi, the following trustees being present: C.A. Black, J.M. Blodgett, F.O. Hale, G.E. Lawrence and C.A. Rich. President Lawrence presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of Sep. 4, 1912, were read and approved.

Ge. E. Henton was granted a permit to erect a dwelling in Barnhart Tract.

F.J. Saety, of the East Side Improvement Club, complained that in some places the trees were not trimmed as required by the ordinance.

C.H. Suess complained that in some parts of the City houses were not numbered as required by the ordinance, and cited Mr. Saety as having the wrong number on his house.

The above matters were referred to the Marshal with instructions to enforce the ordinances in these particulars.

Supt. Henning asked to be allowed to have some one else inspect the plumbing in the Cary Building. Authorized to get some one.

Clerk instructed to take up the matter of moving poles with Mr. Butler.

On motion of Black, seconded by Rich, the City Engineer was instructed to survey and mark the City limits, after getting prices on monuments and reporting to Finance Committee.

On motion of Rich, seconded by Blodgett, the Superintendent of Water and Lights was instructed to have the broken pane of glass in the transformer house replaced with a new one.

ORDINANCE NO. 61.

Ordinance No. 61, entitled, "An Ordinance Requiring Theaters, Opera Houses, School Houses, Public Halls, and Certain Other Buildings To Be Provided with Exits, Fire Escapes and Standpipes; Prohibiting the Fastening of Doors and Exits, and the Obstructing of Aisles and Passage-ways during Public Gatherings", having been read and introduced on September 4th., was read and placed on passage.

It was moved by Rich, seconded by Black, that Ordinance No. 61 be adopted as read, which motion was carried and the ordinance adopted by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Black, Blodgett, Hale, Lawrence and Rich.
Noes: None. Absent: None.

ORDINANCE NO. 62.

Ordinance No. 62, entitled, "An Ordinance Levying Taxes in the Year 1912 in Provision of Revenue for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 1913", having been read and introduced on September 4th., was read and placed on passage.

It was moved by Blodgett, seconded by Hale, that Ordinance No. 62 be adopted as read, which motion was carried and the ordinance adopted by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Black, Blodgett, Hale, Lawrence and Rich.
Noes: None. Absent: None.

ORDINANCE NO. 63.

Ordinance No. 63, entitled, "An Ordinance of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi Regulating the Making of Excavations in Public Streets, Roads, Alleys, and Places in said City of Lodi, and Repealing All Ordinances in Conflict therewith", was read, and, on motion of Hale, seconded by Blodgett, Ordinance No. 63 was introduced and laid on the table for not less than five days exclusive of the day of introduction.

The claim of ~~XX~~ J.W. McAfee of \$15.00 on account of salary, having been approved by the Finance Committee, was allowed and ordered paid.

On motion of Black, seconded by Hale, it was ordered that the salary of Engineer McAfee be increased \$10.00, beginning September 1st., 1912.
