

Public Hall, Lodi, California, July 25, 1910.

In adjourned regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi, the following Trustees being present: J.M. Blodgett, C.E. Lawrence, C.A. Rich and L. Willinger. Absent: Trustee Hale. President Lawrence presiding.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A communication from the Standard Water Meter Co. was read and filed.

A communication from Health Officer Colman in regard to the water collecting in pools in front of the Hotel was read and referred to the Supt. of Streets.

A communication from G.G. Hepper asking for the position of Plumbing Inspector was read and filed.

Engineer recommended that Appleton and Frederickson Bros. be granted a two weeks' extension of time in which to complete their contract. Upon motion of Trustee Rich, seconded by Trustee Blodgett, the extension was granted.

A communication from the Pacific Tel. & Tel. Co. asking for permission to use some of the City poles was read and referred to Engineer Henderson and Superintendent Henning.

The matter of placing water meters was left in the hands of Superintendent Henning, with a recommendation that the two inch meter now doing service at the park be placed at the Lodi Hotel.

Supt. Henning was instructed to get a pair of rubber boots for the use of the pipe man.

It was resolved that out of the tax levy of 1909 the sum of \$900.00 be apportioned from the General Fund to the Library Fund for use during the fiscal year of 1910-11.

It was moved and seconded that the President of the Board be authorized to enter into a contract with American Cast Iron Pipe Co. and with United States Pipe Co. The motion was carried by the affirmative votes of Trustees Blodgett, Rich and Willinger.

Upon the recommendation of Engineer Henderson, it was ordered, by motion regularly made and carried, that the Bond of the American Cast Iron Pipe Company be fixed at \$10,000.00 and of the United States Pipe Company at \$1,000.00.

It was moved and seconded that this Board do now adjourn until Friday evening, July 29th., 1910, at the usual hour and place. Carried and so ordered.
