

Public Hall, Lodi, California, Oct. 7, 1910.

In adjourned regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi, the following Trustees being present: J.M. Blodgett, F.C. Hale, G.E. Lawrence, C.A. Rick and H. Villinger. President Lawrence presiding.

The Minutes of the Previous Meeting were read and approved.

John Baumbach was granted a permit to erect a barn on lots 5 & 6 of Block 42.

Mr. H. Newfield stated to the Board that his water rate of \$3.00 per month was too high and that he desired it reduced. He said that his light rate for the month of August was twice what it had been under the old rate, but that since installing a meter his rate was satisfactory. He thought he should have a rebate on the August bill. The matter of the regulating charges for water for stores was placed in the hands of the Clerk. It was the sense of the Board no rebates be granted on light bills paid on the basis of the rates fixed by the ordinance.

The written report of Supt. Henning on the matter of the Dougherty, Whitaker & Ray Co's. lights was read. The Board seemed to be agreed that large consumers of current should be charged at the rate of \$.06 per K.W.Hr. for 750 K.W. or less and at the rate of \$.04 per K.W.Hr. for ~~above 750 K.W.~~ Henderson on the Telephone matter was read.


The Report of Engineer Henderson on the Contract of Gladding McBean & Co. was read.
