

Public Hall, Lodi, California, Oct. 10, 1910.

In adjourned regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi, the following trustees being present: J.M. Blodgett, F. C. Hale, G.E. Lawrence, C.A. Rich and L. Willinger. President Lawrence presiding.

The Minutes of the Previous Meeting were read and approved.

The Applications of W.C. Corbin and C.R. Fisher for the position of sewer inspector were read and filed.

Mr. Jno. C. Bewley was present and offered the Grove, known as the Church of God or Willinger Grove to the City for the sum of \$8000.00, of which sum \$2500.00 was to be cash and the balance in five yearly payments with interest at 6% per annum. The matter was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Mr. F.J. Lease stated that he intended to move his laundry into the City and wished to know if there would be any objection to the flowage of the water from the laundry into the sewers. Mr. Henderson stated that if properly grease-trapped there would be no detrimental effects from the wash water.

The following claims against the City were allowed and ordered paid:

The matter of a Plumbing Ordinance was taken up and discussed Messrs. Gerlach, Krumb and Squires offering a few remarks.

Upon motion the Board then adjourned until Oct. 12, 1910, at the usual hour and place.
