In a ~~closed~~ regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi, the following Trustees being present: J.M. Slodgett, F.O. Hale, J.A. Rich and L. Willinger. Absent: President Lawrence and City Clerk. J.M. Mc Mason, Trustee Rich acting as Clerk Pro Tem.

Trustee F.O. Hale was chosen President Pro Tem.

The Minutes of the Previous Meeting were read and approved.

The following Applications for Building Permits were read and granted.

Jas. Culbertson, Dwelling on Lot 8, Block 3, E. Lodi.

W.E. Williams, buggy shed on Lot 12, Block 49 Brier and Keeney Addition.

Appleton & Frederickson Bros offered to sell the City 55 pieces of 7/8" iron averaging twelve feet to the piece and weighing 2.835 pounds to the foot. The iron was already bent on circle to be used in manholes, and the price asked was \$2.80 per hundred pounds. The Board agreed to buy the same on the recommendation of Engineer H.H. Henderson.

A communication from the League of California Municipalities was read and filed.

On motion the acceptance of the Sewer System was laid over until Wednesday Night, Oct. 19, 1910.
