

Public Hall, Lodi, California. Feb. 6, 1911.

In regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi, the following Trustees being present: J.M. Blodgett, F.O. Hale, G.E. Lawrence and C.A. Rich. President Lawrence presiding. Absent: . . . Trustee L. Villinger.

The Minutes of the meeting of January 23, 1911, were read and approved.
