

Public Hall, Lodi, California, Sep. 11, 1911.

In adjourned regular session of the Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi, the following trustees being present: J.M. Blodgett, F.O. Hale, G.E. Lawrence, C.A. Rich and L. Villinger. President Lawrence presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of Sep. 5, 1911, were read and approved.

C.M. Bowling was granted permission to erect a barn at 341 E. Lodi Avenue.

ORDINANCE NO. 57.

Ordinance No. 57, an ordinance levying taxes in the year 1911, was read, and, on motion, introduced and laid on the table for not less than five days exclusive of the day of introduction.

It was moved by Trustee Hale, seconded by Trustee Blodgett, that T.H. Myers be appointed a night watchman at a salary of \$75.00 per month, which motion was unanimously carried.


The matter of allowing West & Sons Winery to discharge considerable quantities of water into the sewer was discussed in conjunction with the failure of the pumps to handle the water at the Septic tank. Whole matter referred to sewer committee.

Supt. Henning reported the amount of pipe required to reach the cement pipe works. The Board did not favor the expenditure.

The matter of employing an attorney to prosecute cases of violation of City ordinances was taken up, and Trustee Hale authorized to instruct Marshal Coleman to take the matter up with Judge Steele.
