Ordinance No. 40

Ordinance No. 40, entitled, "An Ordinance Regulating the Speed of Animals, Wagons, Buggies, Carriages, Sulkeys, Bicycles, Automobiles, Motor Cars, Railroad Cars, Cars, Locomotives, Motor Vehicles and other vehicles in, On, Along or Across Public Streets or Ways; And Repealing Sections Seven and Eleven of Ordinance No. Nine; and partially Repealing Section One of Ordinance No Seventeen," was introduced, read and upon motion regularly made, seconded and carried, the Ordinance was laid on the table for a period of not less than five days exclusive of the day of introduction.

Trustees Hale and Villinger were appointed a Committee to arrange for Speed Signs as follows: "Slow Down to 10 Miles."

Messrs. Newell and Broadhurst, Civil Engineers of 321 Elks Bldg., Stockton, were present, and entered into an informal discussion of the proposed City Improvements.
