

ORDINANCE NO. 208

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ELECTRICAL INTERFERENCE
WITH RADIO RECEPTION, AND PROVIDING FOR PUNISHMENT
FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Lodi:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, copartnership, association or corporation, knowingly or wantonly to operate or cause to be operated, any machine, device, apparatus or instrument of any kind whatever, within the corporate limits of the City of Lodi, the operation of which shall cause reasonably preventable electrical interference with radio reception within said municipal limits,

Section 2. That this ordinance shall not be held or construed to embrace or cover the regulation of any transmitting, broadcasting or receiving instrument, apparatus or device used or useful in interstate commerce, or the operation of which instrument, apparatus or device is licensed or authorized by any act of Congress of the United States.

Section 3. That every person, firm, copartnership, association or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, nor more than three hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the city or county jail for one day for each two dollars of such fine not paid, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each day during which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be published one time in "THE LODI SENTINEL", a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in the City of Lodi and shall be in effect thirty days from and after its passage, approval and publication.
