

ORDINANCE NO. 96.

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES AND COMPENSATION OF THE CITY CLERK,
TREASURER, MARSHAL, RECORDER, HEALTH OFFICER AND SUPERINTENDENT OF
STREETS, AND FIXING THE BONDS OF THE CLERK, TREASURER AND MARSHAL,
AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 44, ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LODI.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi do ordain as follows:

The officers of the City of Lodi hereinafter named, from and after
the 15th day of April, A. D. 1918, shall severally receive compensation
as follows, the same to be in full for all services during their
respective terms:

CITY CLERK

Section 1. The City Clerk and Ex-Officio Assessor shall receive
a salary of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per month for his
services as such Clerk and Ex-Officio Assessor.

CITY TREASURER

Section 2. The City Treasurer shall receive as compensation for
all his services, as such treasurer and as City Tax Collector, the sum
of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per annum, payable quarterly.

CITY MARSHAL

Section 3. The City Marshal and Ex-Officio License Collector
shall receive a salary of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month for
his services as such Marshal and Ex-Officio License Collector.

The City Marshal shall receive the sum of Forty Dollars (\$40.00)
per month for his services as Superintendent of Streets of the City
of Lodi.

CITY RECORDER

Section 4. The City Recorder shall receive a salary of Twenty
Dollars (\$20.00) per month for his services in criminal prosecution of
violation of City Ordinances, and he shall receive from the parties in
civil cases, such fees as may be allowed by statute to Justices of the
Peace, in the County of San Joaquin, for like services and payable in
like manner.

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HEALTH OFFICER

Section 5. The City Health Officer shall receive a salary of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per month,

Section 6. The Clerk, Treasurer and Marshal, respectively, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices shall each execute a bond to the City of Lodi, in the following penal sums, Clerk \$3,000.00 , Treasurer \$60,000.00, and Marshal \$2,000.00.

Section 7. Ordinance No. 44 and all other ordinances of the City of Lodi, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be published in The Lodi Sentinel, and shall take effect and be in force from and after the 15th day of April, A. D. 1918,


