

ORDINANCE NO.44.

An Ordinance Fixing the Salaries and Compensation of the City Clerk, Treasurer, Marshal, Recorder, Health Officer and Superintendent of Streets, and Repealing; Ordinance No. Five, Ordinances of the City of Lodi.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Lodi do ordain as follows:

The officers of the City of Lodi hereinafter named, from and after the eighteenth day of April, 1910, shall severally receive compensation as follows, the same to be in full for all services during their respective terms:

City Clerk Section 1.- The City Clerk and Ex-Officio Assessor shall receive a salary of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) per month for his services as Clerk and Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) per month for his services as Assessor and such other sum or sums as may be allowed by the Board of Trustees for extra services rendered the City by order of said Board, but in no instance shall the aggregate sum paid the said Clerk for salary and other services exceed the sum of One Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars (\$125.00) in any one month. If in the judgment of the Board the employment of deputies are at any time necessary, the Board may provide for their employment and compensation.

City Treasurer. Section 2.- The City Treasurer shall receive as compensation one per cent on all moneys received and paid by him as such Treasurer, and he may credit himself with such per cent in his settlement with the City Clerk. He shall, as deputy marshal appointed for that purpose, collect all taxes due the City, but he shall not receive for <sup>all</sup> his services more than the sum of Three Hundred Dollars in any one year.

City Marshal. Section 3.- The City Marshal and Ex-Officio Tax and License Collector shall receive a salary of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per month for his services as Marshal and Ex-Officio Tax Collector. He shall at the proper time appoint one deputy to assist in the collection of taxes due the City, which said deputy

shall be the acting City Treasurer. The Marshal shall have general supervision of the streets of the City of Lodi, and he shall receive for such services the sum of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per month.

City Recorder.

Section 4.- The City Recorder shall receive a salary of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per month for his services in criminal ~~xxx~~ prosecution for violation of City ordinances, and he shall receive from the parties in civil cases <sup>such fees</sup> as are or may be allowed by the statute to Justices of the Peace for like services, provided that the City shall pay no costs or fees not collected from the adverse party and when less than the whole amount adjudged to the City be collected. Such cost shall be payable pro rata with the amount collected.

Health Officer.

Section 5.- The City Health Officer shall receive a salary of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per month.

Section 6.- Ordinance No. Five, Ordinances of the City of Lodi, is hereby repealed.

Section 7.- This ordinance shall be in force and take effect on the eighteenth day of April, 1910.

Section 8.- This ordinance shall be published once in The Lodi Sentinel, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Lodi.
