

ORDINANCE NO. 445

AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 346 ENTITLED
 "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ERECTION,
 CONSTRUCTION, ENLARGEMENT, ALTERATION,
 REPAIR, MOVING, REMOVAL, CONVERSION,
 DEMOLITION, OCCUPANCY, EQUIPMENT, USE,
 HEIGHT, AREA AND MAINTENANCE OF BUILD-
 INGS OR STRUCTURES IN THE CITY OF LODI,
 CALIFORNIA, PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE
 OF PERMITS AND COLLECTION OF FEES THERE-
 FOR: DECLARING AND ESTABLISHING FIRE
 DISTRICTS: PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE
 VIOLATION THEREOF AND REPEALING ALL
 ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN
 CONFLICT HEREWITH IN SO FAR AS SUCH
 CONFLICT MAY EXIST"

The City Council of the City of Lodi does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 346, entitled as above set forth,
 is hereby amended by adding thereto Section 1-a, reading as
 follows:

Section 1-a. That portion of Section 401 (g) of said
 Uniform Building Code defining private garages shall read:

"GARAGE, PRIVATE, is a building, or a portion
 of a building, in which only motor vehicles used
 by the tenants of the building or buildings on
 the premises are stored or kept. (See Section
 1509)"

The remaining portions of said section are not affected
 hereby.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be published one time in
 The Lodi Times and shall be in force and take effect at the time
 provided by law.
