

ORDINANCE NO. 72.....
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 18
AND 19 OF ORDINANCE NO. 9 OF THE CITY
OF LODI.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF LODI, do ordain
as follows:-

SEC. 1. Sections 18 and 19 of Ordinance No. 9 of the
City of Lodi are hereby amended to read as follows:-

Sec., 18. Any person under the age of twenty-
one years who shall visit any saloon, bar-room, dram-shop,
tippling house, or other place where spirituous, vinous, malt
or intoxicating liquors are sold as a beverage or who shall
frequent any improper place or resort, is guilty of a mis-
demeanor,

Sec. 19. Any proprietor, keeper, manager, em-
ployee or person having the control of any saloon, bar-room,
dram-shop, tippling house, or other place where spirituous,
vinous, malt or intoxicating liquors are sold as a beverage,
who allows or permits any person under the age of twenty-
one years to visit such place is guilty of a misdemeanor;

Provided, however, that nothing herein shall be
construed as applying to any such person visiting the dining
room of any hotel or restaurant.


SEC. 2. ~~This~~ ordinance shall be in force and take effect
from and after thirty days from date of passage and publication.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall be published by being printed
and posted in three public places in the City of Lodi.
