WHEREAS, on June 2, 1982, the Lodi City Council adopted Ordinance No. 1252 entitled, "An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Lodi Amending Article V (Stopping, Standing and Parking) of Chapter 14 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic) of the Lodi City Code".

Section 1 of Ordinance No. 1262 provides that "the City Council, by Resolution, shall designate standing or parking restrictions within the City of Lodi, and the City Engineer shall be authorized to erect signs, or curb markings in areas so designated by Resolution of the City Council of the City of Lodi."

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lodi that notice is hereby given that on Wednesday, July 21, 1982, at the hour of 8:00 P.M. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, the Lodi City Council will conduct a public hearing in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 221 West Pine Street, Lodi, to consider the adoption of a resolution, as provided in Ordinance No. 1262, designating standing or parking restrictions within the City of Lodi as it pertains to Lodi Avenue from Ham Lane to Central Avenue.

All interested persons are invited to present their views on this matter. Written statements may be filed with the City Clerk at any time prior to the hearing scheduled herein and oral statements may be made at said hearing.
