

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LODI OF INTENTION TO ADOPT ORDINANCE ENTITLED "ADOPTING AN ELECTRICAL CODE REGULATING THE INSTALLATION, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRIC WIRING AND ELECTRICALLY OPERATED APPLIANCES TO BE CONNECTED THERETO BY ADOPTING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM ELECTRICAL CODE", 1953 EDITION, WHICH IN TURN ADOPTS BY REFERENCE THE "NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE", 1953 EDITION, ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 480" AND FIXING A TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON

W H E R E A S, the City Council of the City of Lodi, by first reading, concurred in the adoption by reference of the "Uniform Electrical Code", 1953 Edition, and the Secondary Code therein referred to,

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Lodi hereby resolves and declares as follows:

I

That for the purpose of describing the rules and regulations covering the installation of electrical wiring and equipment, the "Uniform Electrical Code", 1953 Edition, including the Secondary Code therein referred to, namely, "National Electrical Code", 1953 Edition, be adopted by reference.

II

That the name and address of the Agency promulgating said Primary Code referred to in the "Uniform Electrical Code", 1953 Edition, is Pacific Coast Electrical Association, Inc., 681 Market Street, San Francisco, California, and a description thereof which the City Council deems sufficient to give notice to interested persons of the purpose of the Primary Code is as follows: Said Code describes the duties of the Building Official, requires the issuance of permits for installation of electrical wiring, etc., sets fees for the issuance of permits, provides inspection and certificates to be issued, and adopts by reference the provisions of the "National Electrical Code".

### III

That the name and address of the Agency promulgating said Secondary Code referred to in the "Uniform Electrical Code", 1953 Edition, is National Board of Fire Underwriters, 465 California Street, San Francisco 4, California, and a description thereof which the City Council deems sufficient to give notice to interested persons of the purpose of the Secondary Code is as follows: The purpose of this Code is the practical safeguarding of persons and of buildings and their contents from hazards arising from the use of electricity for light, heat, power, radio, signalling, and for other purposes. It covers the electric conductors and equipment installed within or on public and private buildings and other premises, including yards, carnival and parking lots, and industrial substations; also the conductors that connect the installations to a supply of electricity, and other outside conductors adjacent to the premises.

### IV

That not less than three copies of said "Uniform Electrical Code", 1953 Edition, and said "National Electrical Code", 1953 Edition, all certified to be true copies by the City Clerk, have heretofore been filed with the City Clerk of this City in compliance with Section 50022.6 of the Government Code and are open to public inspection.

### V

That Wednesday, February 2, 1955, at the hour of 8:00 a.m. of said day at the Council Chambers at the City Hall in the City of Lodi, State of California, is hereby fixed as the time and place when and where any persons having objections to the adoption of said Codes by ordinance in the manner aforesaid, may appear before said City Council and show cause, if any they have, why said Codes should not be so adopted as proposed.

VI

That the City Clerk of the City of Lodi is hereby directed to cause a copy of this Resolution and Notice to be published in the Lodi News-Sentinel, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the City of Lodi once at least 8 days preceding the date set for the hearing of objections, and once at least 15 days preceding said hearing.
