

Council Chambers-City Council
The City Hall - City of Lodi
Monday - February 4 - 1929.

The City Council of the City of Lodi met in regular session at 8.05 o'clock P.M. on the date and at the place first above written, Councilmen Hale, Roach, Shattuck, Weihe and Spooner present, none absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 21, 1929 were read, approved as read and so endorsed by the Mayor.

No persons being in attendance, the order of Public Hearings was passed and the Council proceeded to hear communications and reports.

Reports of the City Poundmaster and the Chief of Police covering the month of January were received, read and ordered filed.

The Secretary of Lodi Volunteer Fire Department advised the City Council by letter that the Salary of the Secretary had been increased from \$5.00 to 10.00 monthly. On motion duly made and carried, the Clerk was instructed to notify the Department that this increase could not be recognized, no request having been received for an additional appropriation for this purpose.

The Council also received a letter from the Fire Department notifying them of changes in the organization of the department which was ordered filed without comment.

Specifications covering the public printing of the City for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1929 were presented by the City Clerk and on being read, were ordered approved and adopted by the passage of Resolution No. 570 by the following vote :-

AYES: Councilmen, Shattuck, Hale, Roach, Weihe & Spooner.

NOES: NONE ABSENT: NONE

A communication from Mr. Nelson A. Eckart stating that his fee for reporting on the feasibility of the Colorado Power Company site lately acquired by the City for power generating purposes would be \$1,000.00 was laid over for further consideration.

Mr. W. J. Robinson Jr. representing Woodbridge Irrigation District addressed the Council on alleged additional expense placed on the district by reason of the flowage of storm and sewage waters in their main line canal. After some discussion, the matter was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

On motion of Councilman Shattuck, Roach second, Mr. Forrest E. Cooper was allowed the sum of \$10.00 monthly for use of his private automobile used in connection with the City Pound.

Bills in the amount of \$10,774.17 as approved by the Finance Committee were allowed and ordered paid on motion of Councilman Hale, Weihe second.

As Committee of the Whole, the Council then informally discussed the matter brought up by Mr Robinson and considered the contracts under which the City obtained its flowage rights from the former owners of the canal. The contracts were referred to the City Attorney for his opinion as to their meaning, deferring any action on Mr Robinsons contention and on the report of the District's engineer until a later date.

On motion of Councilman Weihe, the City Council adjourned to the hour and date of their next regular meeting.
